Boxer Says Offered \$500

"To Take Dive" In Fight

SAN ANTONIO, Tex. (AP)—The boxer County grand jury Wednesday checked into a story by boxer Dick Goldstein of Los Angeles that he had been offered \$500 to "take a dive" in his scheduled bout Tuesday night with Art Aragon, three-ranked contender.

Goldstein also said his life had been threatened. The fight never came off. Aragon called in Dr. C. D. Henry, state boxing commission doctor, who said Aragon had a reddened throat and a slight fever.

"I am flabbergasted," Police Sgt. Ray Byler, one of the authorities to whom Goldstein talked, said. Goldstein predicted Aragon would "come down sick" hours before the fight was scheduled.

Pro Football Is Rough

By WHITNEY MARTIN NEW YORK (AP)—A stranger to these shores, reading about pro football games, might be surprised to see a man say: "This is rough."

He could be excused for getting the idea the players make up the rules as they go along, the officials are a bunch of flea-brained incompetents and that standard equipment includes their fists, tomahawks and brass knuckles. Seldom has a season produced more terrifying yowls of anguish from coaches and club officials, with those who think their rights have been maimed beyond repair practically standing in line waiting their turn to see the harried National Football League commissioner, Bert Bell.

STILL ECHOING Just last Sunday, the Chicago Bears-Detroit Lions game produced an incident which still is producing an echo-choking. It involved the incapacitating injury suffered by Bobby Layne, Detroit's star quarterback, as a result of a tackle by Ed Meadows, Bear end.

We did not see the incident. In fact, as a televisioner we didn't even see Layne carried from the field. Layne was merely stating a standard explanation even if an athlete has broken a leg or cracked a few ribs. There seems to be no doubt that Meadows made the tackle, and the only picture we saw failed to show anything illegal about it. Layne was being hit from behind by the end, obviously with considerable vigor.
