

Archbishop, Six Bishops May Retire

OTTAWA (CP)—Canada may lose an archbishop and six bishops as a result of Pope Paul VI's decision that pastors should retire by the time they reach 75.

A spokesman for the Canadian Catholic Conference said here six of the men are already well beyond retirement age. The seventh becomes eligible for retirement this year.

The spokesman said all seven are expected to voluntarily retire when a papal document, dealing with many council regulations, goes into force Oct. 11.

Already, six of the men have found the diocesan work too strenuous and have taken on assistants to help with the load.

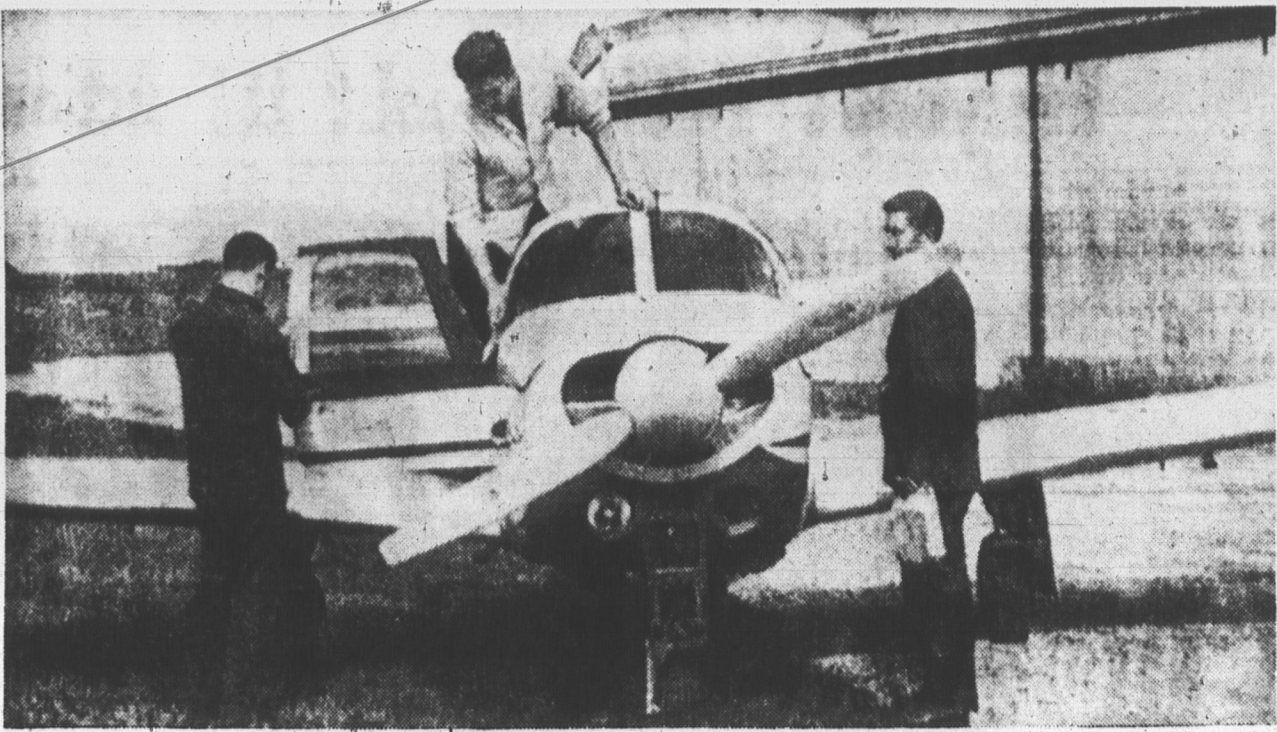
The most influential prelate affected by the decision would be Archbishop Joseph O'Sullivan of Kingston. He will be 80 this year.

The two oldest bishops are Joseph Papineau of Joliette, Que., and J.C. Schaumont, retired auxiliary bishop of Montreal. Both are 91.

Bishop Joseph Langlois, 90, of Valleyfield, Que. already has an assistant who is expected to succeed him.

Others are Bishop Rosario Brodeur, 77, of Alexandria, Que.; Bishop Francis P. Carroll, 76, of Calgary; and Bishop Joseph Desmarais, 75, of Amos, Que.

Under the new provision, Archbishop O'Sullivan and the bishops would retain their titles if they retired. Their successors would be recommended by an episcopal conference and named by the Pope.

Wholesale Price Index Reviewed

OTTAWA (CP)—A broad index of wholesale prices showed a barely measurable increase in July from June, but the level was three per cent higher than July, 1965, the Dominion Bureau of Statistics reported Tuesday.

Based on wholesale prices in 1935-39 as 100, the index in July stood at 259.7 compared with 259.6 in June.

Five of eight major groups of products experienced price increases during the month. These included wood products, reflecting price increases for newsprint, furniture, hardwoods and pine; and vegetable products on higher prices for grains, tea, coffee, cocoa, cereal foods, onions, sugar and sugar products.

Lower prices during the month for livestock and fresh meats helped bring down wholesale prices for animal products.

Say Assassin Has Grievance

CAPE TOWN (Reuters)—Premier Hendrik Verwoerd's assassin is a South African government did too much for non-whites and not enough for poor whites, it was reported here.

The man, Dmitri Stafendaa, of Greek-Portuguese extraction, was being questioned by senior officers of the criminal investigation department and the security branch. They gave no motive for his knife attack on the premier.

Stafendaa, a tall, well-built man in his forties with crinkly grey hair, worked as a temporary messenger in the parliamentary press gallery for less than a month. Fellow-messengers said they thought he lived alone.

The parliamentary correspondent of the newspaper Die Vaderland recalled Stafendaa's complaints of the government's treatment of poor whites.

Acadia U Gym Contract Let

WOLFVILLE, N.S. (CP)—The Kentville, N.S. construction firm of V.C. Woodworth has been awarded a contract worth more than \$2,000,000 for major new gymnasium facilities at Acadia University here.

The announcement was made by University president, Dr. J.M.R. Beveridge.

New facilities will be constructed as an extension of the present Memorial Gymnasium. The addition and renovations to the present building will provide about six times the area for gymnasium facilities and are designed to cope with Acadia's planned enrollment of 5,000 by 1975.

Work is scheduled to be completed by September, 1967.
