

Transfer Of Teeth Is Claimed 'First'

TORONTO (CP) — A Toronto physician and dentist has claimed the first successful transfer of teeth from one person to another, it was learned here Tuesday.

Dr. Samuel W. Leslie, in a scientific paper to the International Congress on Plastic Surgery in London, reported three successful transplants to Harvey Eisen, 19, of Toronto, and his son Peter Leslie, 24.

Eisen, the first patient, had a lower eye tooth transplanted from his sister Jill, 11, who had to lose the tooth for orthodontic treatment. The transplant took place 18 months ago and x-rays show a new root.

Eisen said in an interview: "It's the best tooth I have. It felt a little funny at first, but now it is completely firm and I can bite or chew as hard as I like with it."

The student lost a tooth and had several others broken when he was hit in the mouth by a puck in a hockey game in January, 1958.

Peter Leslie has two upper teeth transplants, one from a nine-year-old girl and one from an 11-year-old girl. Both had to lose the teeth in treatment.

Young Leslie said Tuesday the two teeth are "like my very own."

In his paper, Dr. Leslie said the work is a pilot project and blood tests on the two patients are needed.

A former president of the College of General Practice of Canada, he said there is similarity between his tooth transplant technique and that employed in skin grafting.

His technique uses the sac which surrounds the tooth during its growth.

Dr. Leslie said he sews the sac around the transplanted tooth and believes it is this attachment which helps the transplant "take."

Adventurers Work To Get Passage Home

ST. JOHN'S, Nfld. (CP) — Three Montreal adventurers who made an unsuccessful bid to sail the Atlantic in an 18-foot steel tank now are looking for work in Europe so they can make enough money to return to Canada.

All three now are in their native countries: Albert Barth in Germany, Robert Frantz in Paris and skipper Richard Melish in Vienna, Austria.

A British freighter picked the men up about 200 miles off Newfoundland and took them to Rotterdam after their strange craft caught fire.

The barrel, christened Diogenes in Montreal, began its sailing, drifting voyage to Europe from here June 15.

SEND LETTER BACK

In a letter to Evening Telegram reporter Don Morris, Melish said "we really started to have the time of our lives" after two days of seasickness.

"The sail was up. The wind was favorable, and we ran about 20 miles the first day. The second day we had the first storm and the wind changed. Diogenes behaved very well and we waited for the wind to become westerly again."

"Wednesday June 17 we pursued our course. Everything was fine. Then it happened."

"Somehow the kerosene stove caught fire. The flames caught some rags and in spite of our noticing the fire right away there was little we could do."

"The extinguisher did not work. I tried to stop the flames with rags and with the sleeping bag, but no success. There was little room for Albert or Robert to help me. The smoke became too strong and we had to get out."

FEARED EXPLOSION

"Fear of an explosion sent them over the side in a dinghy. After about six hours we opened the manhole and saw that the fire was out," Melish wrote.
