Churchill Grand Seigneur Of Hudson's Bay Company

LONDON (CP) - Sir Winston Churchill, already laden with dignities, has accepted a new honor linking his name with a company whose origins go back to the early days of Canada.

Churchill's family links with Hudson's Bay Company, and thus with Canada - date from John Churchill, the first Duke of Marlborough, who became the third governor of the company in 1685.

incorporated by royal charter of King Charles II in 1670, and Prince Rupert was appointed the first governor. The oldest chartered trading company in existence, it has traded continuously in Canada from the days of the romantic past of coureurs de bois, fur traders and log cabins.

72 NEGROES ARRESTED
NEW ORLEANS (AP) - An objection to segregated seating in a city bus resulted in the arrest of 72 Negroes Wednesday night. Police answered a call from a transit company supervisor after the Negroes, many of them students at Xavier University, refused to sit behind a sign dividing white and Negro passengers. City councilman Glenn P. Classen released all except one of the Negroes, who was booked with inciting a riot and disturbing the peace.

YOUTH TRAINING SHORT COURSE VOCATIONAL SCHOOL, CHARLOTTETOWN

The following short courses are offered and may be held if a sufficient number of applications are received.
1. HOME MAKING - A six-week course beginning January 16, 1956 and open to any woman 16 years of age or older. The course will include: cooking and nutrition, sewing, handicrafts, home nursing and other topics of interest to the group.
2. EGG GRADING - A three-week course, beginning in February, and designed to train young men and women in the operation and management of Egg Grading Stations. This course is conducted at Birch Court and the instruction is given by members of the staff of the Federal Department of Agriculture.
