NEW YORK

NEW YORK (AP)—The stock market continued its decline Thursday, failing to respond to a rally in late afternoon.

The Dow Jones industrial average closed 2 1/2 points lower at 200.47.

The Associated Press average of 30 stocks lost 3 1/2 points.

Standard and Poor's 500-stock index closed 3 1/2 points lower at 161.80.

Although trading at times was heavy Thursday, volume was not as brisk as Wednesday's 6,300,000.

Frequently talked-up spot-crop wheat from Texas, Gulf Curtis Publishing was second most active stock.

Next most active was Helene Curtis, down 3/4 at 19 1/4.

General Motors rose 1/4 to 48 1/2, the stake of its record profits.

Bethlehem Steel, which reported higher earnings, was market close, was off 1/4.

IBM fell 1/4, to 147 1/4. American Carbide 1/4, to 14 1/4.

On the Canadian section, Aluminum Ltd. added 1/4 while Granby Mining lost 1/4.

Prices on the American Exchange were mostly lower.

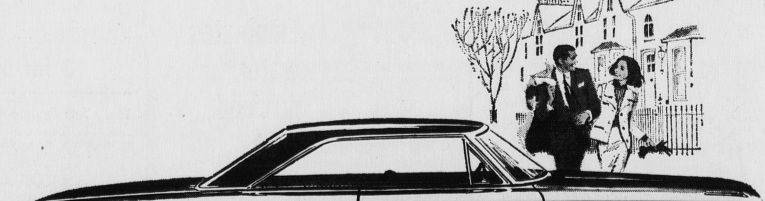
