

Student Union General Meeting

Quorum was finally met at the Student Union general meeting Tuesday afternoon, March 10, 1981. Changes were announced regarding executive positions.

The president will be restricted to four courses per semester. The vice-president's title will become vice-president Internal and will be responsible for the social committee, Fall Fest, and Winter Carnival Committees. The comptroller title becomes vice-president External and the Personnel Board becomes known as the Selection Board.

The hiring board shall be responsible for the recruiting of all part time employees (non-students) and student employees

employed in the Student Union Building. This includes Bartenders, C.P., Maintenance workers, secretary, and receptionists.

The treasurer will handle finances, which the general manager does now. The general manager will be responsible for bar services, C.P.'s, maintenance of physical plant and the purchasing of all supplies. He will work full-time

during the academic year and part-time during the summer, with holidays taken between May and August.

The secretary's position will change to part time, five days per week, with hours from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. with a change in pay from \$6.00 per hour to \$4.00 per hour.

A student receptionist will be hired for general duties such as selling

tickets, providing information, performing minimal typing and petty cash.

The SUN will have its own typist for \$600.00 per year or minimum wage.

A maintenance service person will be hired from 8:00 a.m. to 12 a.m. instead of all day, with a student cleaning person to work when requested.

The estimated savings brought about by these recommendations is \$5,364.00.

advantage of - namely the March break.

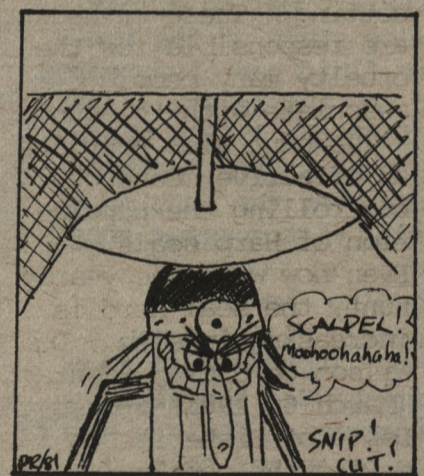
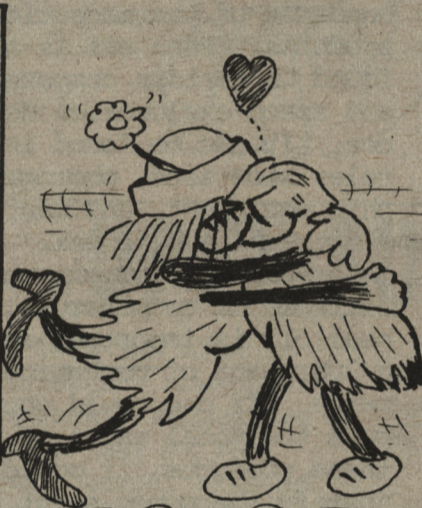
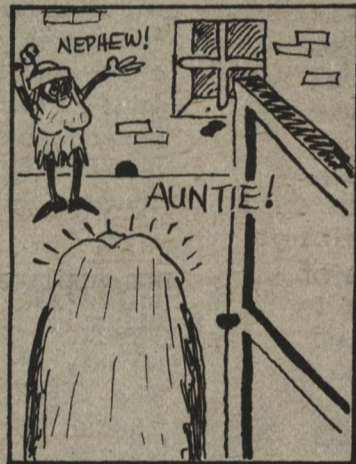
