FAKE "FENCES."

A Little Trick That is Worked in Baxter Street.

"There was a time and that not very long ago," remarked an old time puller in, "when almost every other store in Baxter street was a 'fence,' or pretended to be, in order to give customers the idea that they were getting good bargains. The clerk who took a hesitating customer aside and whispered 'fence' was generally sure of a sale.
