

# Millionaires Score 4-2 Victory Over Glace Bay

SYDNEY, (CP) — Sydney Millionaires moved five points ahead of Glace Bay Miners and to within three games of the league-leading Halifax Atlantics Tuesday night by downing the Miners 4-2 in a Maritime Major Hockey League game.

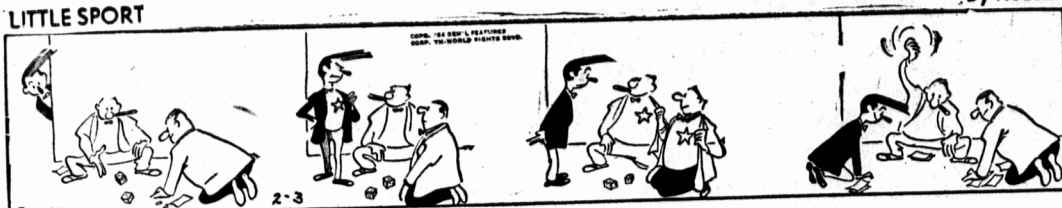

## Australia Will Be Ready For 1956 Olympics

THE HAGUE, (AP) — Australia Tuesday scolded Europeans who have criticized Melbourne's preparations for the 1956 Olympic games.

A statement on the subject by W. S. Kent Hughes, chairman of the Olympic organization committee, was released here by the Australian embassy.

Kent Hughes, Australian minister of the interior, said European newspapers in recent months have been giving a false impression of Melbourne's preparations for the games.

"They are at least as far advanced as those of most previous Olympic cities three years before the games," he said.

"I am sure that the citizens of any major city would agree with me, that three years before the event is a little early to write Melbourne off.

"Despite suggestions to the contrary, Australians are taking their responsibilities as hosts for 1956 very seriously. I realize that nearly every city chosen for this honor in the past has been a target for criticism.

"We shall be ready in time and we shall do the job in accordance with the highest Olympic traditions."

NEW YORK, (AP) — New York Yankee said Tuesday centre-fielder Mickey Mantle has returned to hospital in Springfield, Mo., for another examination of his right knee.

Mantle underwent an operation for removal of a cartilage from his knee last Nov. 2.

The Yankees said they did not know the reason for the hospital visit.

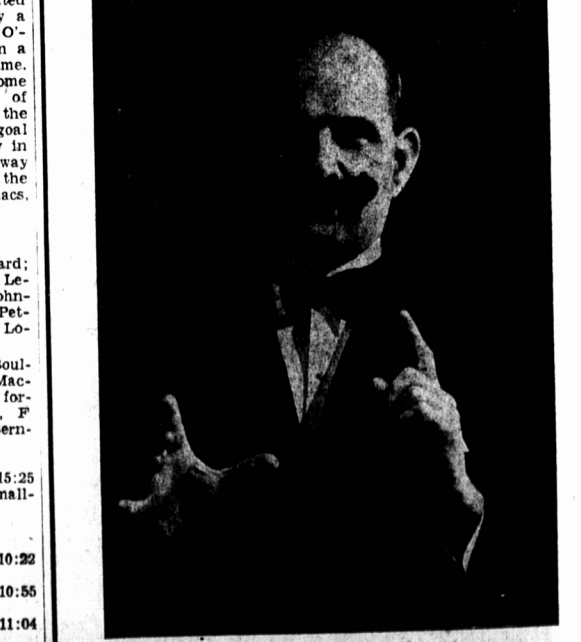
