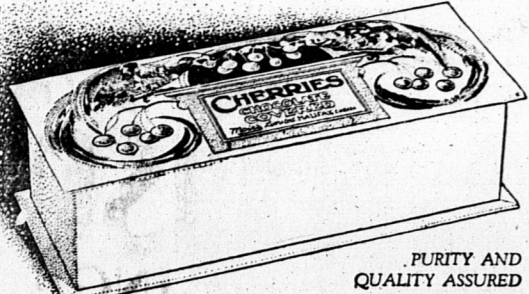

IN THE SUPREME COURT—At Supreme Court yesterday morning the appeal case of Horace McKinnon vs Augustus M. Richards, was heard, judgment being reserved, J. D. Stewart K. C. and J. A. McDonald for plaintiff, Johnston K. C. and Bentley K C for defendant. The appeal case of Michael J. McQueen vs William Jacques is now before the court. This is a breach of contract case tried in Summerside last June before Chief Justice Mathieson and jury when a verdict was given for plaintiff for \$250, the jury standing 5 to 2, on the verdict. Mr Johnston, on behalf of defendant is moving for new trial. Mr Gaudet will reply for plaintiff.

SUSSEX CAMP LATE IN JUNE

FREDERICTON, May 22. — A summer training camp for the units of the New Brunswick militia is to be held at Sussex this year. The dates, June 27 to July 5 and June 22 to June 30 have been suggested for the approval of the commanding officers of the various units, including rural cavalry, engineer and infantry units. Owing to the large cuts in the appropriations for summer camps, not more than forty per cent. of the strength of the various units will be in camp for the special instruction which is to consist of a minimum amount of drill with the maximum musketry and tactical instructions possible.
