Hair as a Cleansing Agent.

That the hair covering the body of an animal or the head of a human being serves the purpose of warmth and protection is manifest, but one would hardly expect to find that it also acts as a cleansing agent. This, however, appears to be the fact. The minute scales which cover the outer portion of a hair are fastened at one end and free at the other, and the free ends lie in the direction away from the skin.

The surface of a hair, therefore, is like that of a piece of fur or cloth covered with up, rubbed from root to tip it is found to be smoother than when rubbed in the opposite direction. This being the case, it is evident that particles of matter in contact with a hair must find their direction of easiest motion to lie toward the tip end of the hair and away from its root. So by virtue of the peculiar structure of its surface the hair serves gradually to remove from the skin which it covers all foreign particles which may have found lodg- ing there.

The oily secretions emanating from the follicles of the hair probably assist the action by gathering up the fine particles of extraneous dust and scales from the skin and thus enabling the hair to retain them, so to speak, in the grasp of its cuticular system of brushes. Every movement of the hair, however produced, must act to some extent in stirring up dirt and motion can be in only one direction. —Philadelphia Times.

Wood Pulp Paper.

A most economical result has attended the recent improved processes in manufacturing wood pulp for paper, consisting ingularly with the fact that, years ago purchasers of sprucewood for pulp were inclined to pay larger prices for smooth clear material than for any other description, it being customary in those days to spend much time in boring out the knots and graining the wood into pulp. Now, however, it is found that the whole substance, knots and all, can be ground up, and then, the specific gravity of the pulp being greater than that of water, the average pulp, they sink to the bottom and can be removed. In fact, in solution sulphite pulp, there is less of the knots left after being in the digester. The knots would be of the ground wood pulp knots are present. The wood pulp grinders prefer logs of full size on account of the larger percentage of clear wood, but in many sections much use is made of the small size. —New York Sun.

Leprosy is said by the Chinese to result from the eating of too much fish, but the real cause is, I believe, still a mystery. Poor blood and uncleanly habits have doubtless a great deal to do with it, but a satisfactory investigation as regards the best means for its prevention and cure is much needed. The disease is prevalent in the south of China the disease is greatly on the increase. The number of victims sent from Hong-Kong to Canton is becoming larger by year, and unless some effective means are adopted to prevent its spreading there seems to be no reason why it should not by and by invade the more northern latitudes, where it has been until now exempt from its ravages. —Gentleman's Magazine.

Thus the roar of the adult lion is terrific, the whinplike being uttered so as to give the animal a larger volume of air proportionately than any other animal.
