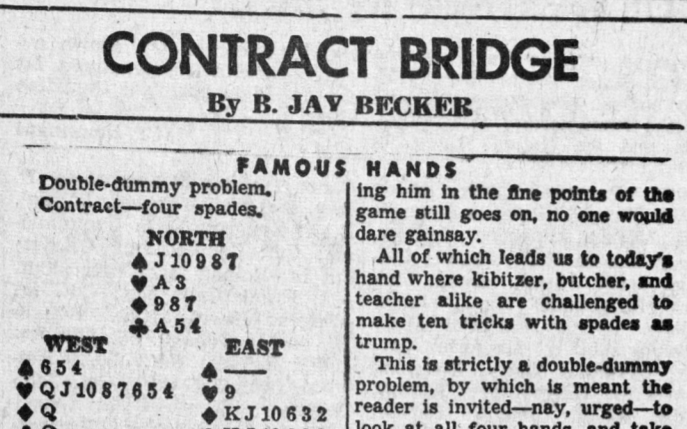

U.K. Bank Rate Cut May Mean Easing Credit Strings

 Canadian Press Staff Writer LONDON (CP) — Britain's action Thursday in reducing the bank rate to five per cent, the same level as that prevailing before the sterling crisis of last September, may signal a general easing of credit restrictions. The reduction of one-half per cent came just 48 hours after the chancellor of the exchequer, Derick Heathcoat Amory, announced increased tax concessions for companies buying new plants and putting up new buildings. The Financial Times says "obviously the movement back toward the policy of economic expansion now is beginning to gather some momentum." The bank rate cut is the third since a heavy run on sterling forced the government to take the drastic action of increasing the rate to seven per cent from five last Sept. 19. On March 20, it was reduced to six per cent, and May 22 it was brought down to 5 1/2 per cent. INCREASED RESERVES The higher bank rate not only increased the vital gold and dol-

Red Legislators Applaud Mention of Nagy Liquidation

BUDAPEST (Reuters) — Communist legislators Thursday applauded mention of Imre Nagy's liquidation while a government leader chided the West for "making a fuss" over the execution. Deputy Premier Antal Apró told parliament the execution of Nagy and three of his associates in the 1956 revolt settled accounts with "criminals who hung the counter-revolutionary uprising around the necks of the people." The executions of Nagy, Maj. Gen. Pal Maleter and two journalists—believed to have been carried out here on Monday—were "stern but just," Apró said. "Not a few people are making a fuss in the West these days because the Hungarian people had a showdown with the criminals of the counter-revolution," Apró added. FOLLOWED REPORT Apró's remarks ended a report on the current three-year plan which the Hungarian Parliament had met to discuss. Hungary was right to forgive these people who had been "deceived" during the 1956 uprising, he said.

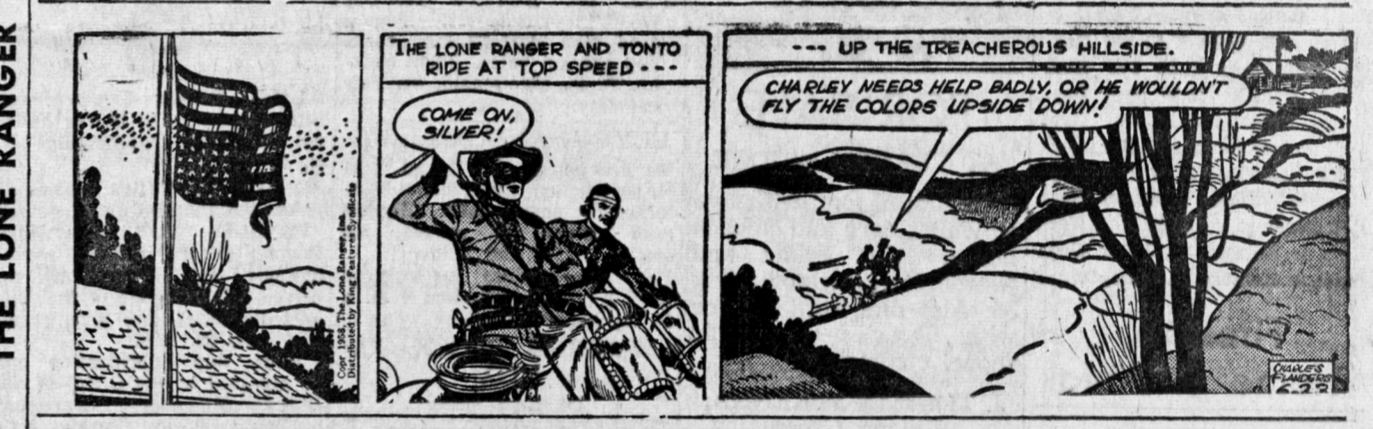
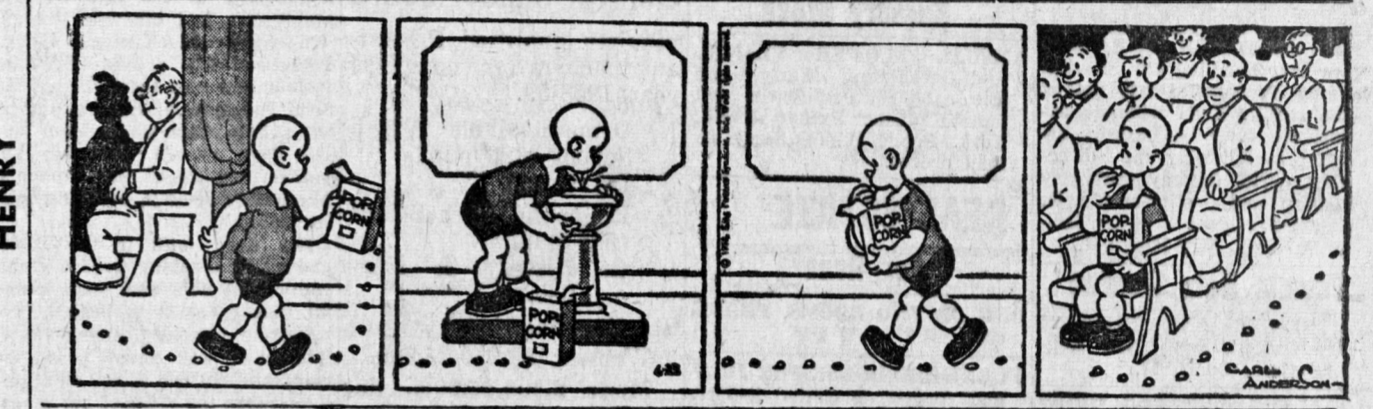
