HIS MOSQUITO CURE.

Why Colonel Benson Soured on Humanitarian Schemes.

Colonel Benson shifted his feet on the table. "Yes," he said, "I have had my share of unusual experiences. About a year ago I was glancing through a scientific journal when a little item tucked away in the corner of a page caught my eye. It was headed like this:

"Intoxication Among Insects—The Mosquito Follows Man's Example." The paragraph went on to say that the natural food of the mosquito consists of various vegetable substances found in bark, mosses, etc. The habit of consuming human blood, it was said, is an acquired taste of the mosquito, similar to the taste for alcoholic drinks among men. Having thus obliterated the hereditary tendency to intemperance, I counted on the speedy regeneration of the mosquito race.

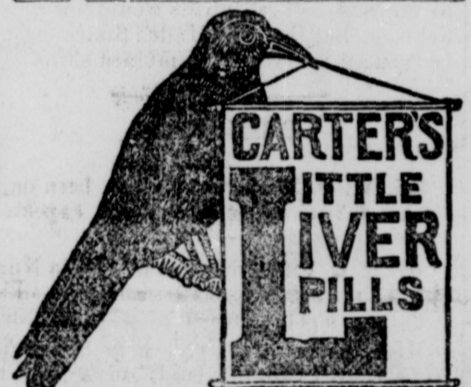

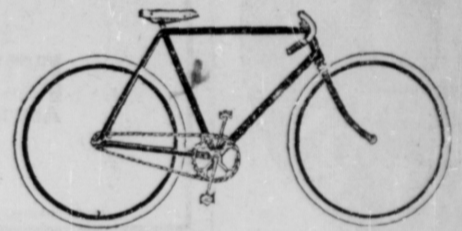
