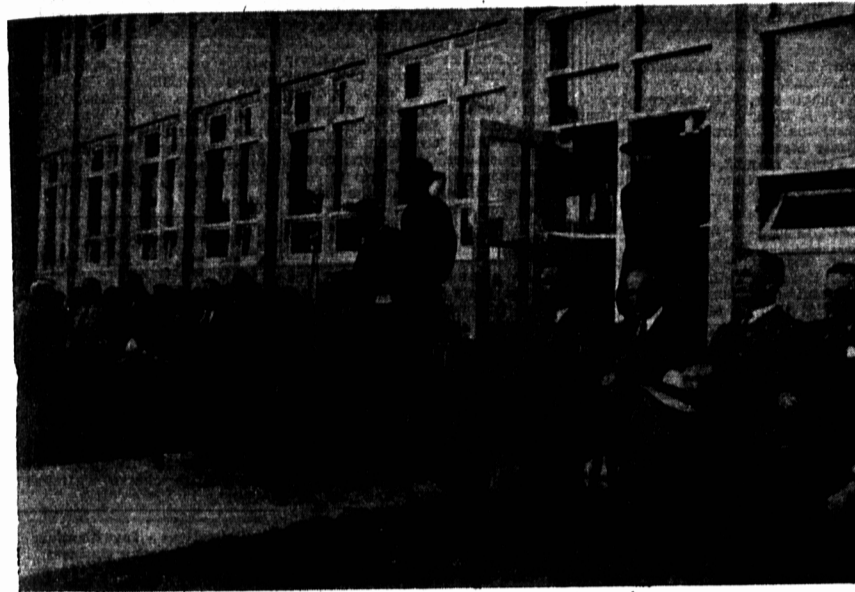


Gives Feature Address At Ceremony

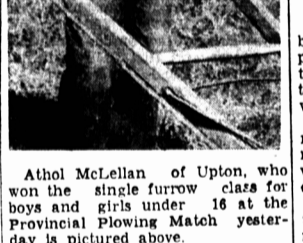
Tractor 3-Sod Winner
