NOTES AND COMMENTS.

The policing of Greater New York this year will cost \$11,327,503 or \$3.29 a head of the population. Next year the estimate calls for \$11,162,323, or \$3.16 per head. And still the place is not good.

The Mail and Empire remarks that "the Prince Edward Island general election was decided on the question of an increased grant from the Federal treasury. By the local Premier the appeal for money was made, and Sir Louis Davies appeared on the scene personally to give the assurance on behalf of his Federal colleagues that Ottawa had been 'deeply impressed' by the proposition, and that the money would be forthcoming if the friendly provincial Ministry were returned by a 'good majority.' We do not blame people for takin' Sir Louis Davies at his word and qualifying for the new grant. During the past few years they have had the experience which comes to all of us where so-called Liberal Governments rule. Their resources have been swallowed up by schemes that are largely political. With the treasury empty and a debt which for the Island Province is considered large hanging over the community, direct

taxes have been rendered necessary. Every farm pays so much per acre annually to meet the heavy provincial disbursements. Every man is taxed by these Liberals for the purpose of living." While all this is true, it is not very likely that the Dominion Government will be readier to respond to the call of relief that is to be raised by Premier Farquharson than it was to that of Mr. Peters. The Mail and Empire need not be alarmed lest Canada's millions be taken to replenish our empty treasury.

Coming to a Right Mind.

LONDON, Dec. 17.—A special despatch from Standerton, Transvaal, dated Dec. 14, says that General Louis Botha is at Ermelo, taking a peaceful attitude and informing the Burghers that the time has come to submit to the inevitable. It is expected that he will shortly make overtures for peace.

Another Driebund.

LONDON, Dec. 16.—The correspondence relating to the Anglo-German agreement has been laid before Parliament. It reveals the fact that the agreement is now tripartite. Japan alone, of the powers invited to join, made special inquiries of Germany and Great Britain, concerning the agreement. Japan then replied that the Imperial Government having received assurances from the contracting parties, to the effect that in adhering to the agreement in question, they will be placed, in relation to such agreement, in the same position they would have occupied if they had been a signatory instead of an adhering state, does not hesitate to formally declare she will adhere to such an agreement and will accept the principles embodied therein.

The assurances of Germany and Great Britain alluded to are not given. The replies of the other powers do not differ from the previous announcement.

Sensational Arrest.

LONDON, Dec. 17.—The Cape Town correspondent of the Daily Mail, reports the arrest at Worcester, Cape Colony, of Harold Daringale, alleged to be an American, on a charge of fomenting an Afrikaner rebellion. "The arrest," says the despatch, "has made a great sensation, and startling disclosures are promised."
