SOYBEAN MEAL SUBSTITUTE FOR HORSE MEAT

Soybean meal has been used to replace the horse meat portion of the ration fed to foxes at the Experimental Fox Ranch at Summerside, P. E. I. It has been found that when five percent by weight of a growth stimulating factor is added to the soybean meal ration, that there is no significant difference in the average body weights of the soybean-fed foxes compared with those on horse meat.
