

**Local and Other Items.**

**A GOOD RESULT.**—The net amount realized by the Souris teas recently held foots up \$1100. This is a showing up in which all concerned are to be congratulated.

**KILLED BY A FALL.**—Cyrille Labrecque, aged 23 years, of Levis, while working on the steeple of Victorianville Church, Quebec, fell to the ground, a distance of 100 feet, and was almost instantly killed.

**MORE FORTIFICATION WORKS.**—It is said that E-quimalt villages, B. C. is stirred by a rumor that the whole site is about to be acquired by the Imperial Government for the purpose of fortification works and dock yard extension. It is said that the whole village site will shortly be taken possession of and the buildings removed.

**A BAD FIRE.**—A fire at Grand Mere, Que, one night last week, destroyed eight tenement houses, rendering 24 families homeless. They were of the laboring class, situated a mile away from the Laurentian pulp works. There was very little insurance. The fire is supposed to have been set by a drunken tramp in a barn who has not been seen since and probably perished in the fire.

**ADULTERATED PLASTERS.**—The Dominion analyst has completed the analysis of a number of samples of belladonna plasters collected between the localities of Ottawa and Halifax. These plasters are seldom made up by the druggists who sell them, but are mostly manufactured in the United States. According to the standard set down by the analyst 79 per cent were found to be adulterated.
