Kidd Makes Game Try Despite Infected Foot

BOSTON (CP)—Bruce Kidd, the Toronto middle distance star who started the Knights of Columbus track meet here last year by winning the two-mile race, made a game try to repeat his win Saturday night despite an infected foot. He could do no better than third.

But another University of Toronto runner, 22-year-old Bill Crothers, scampered to victory in the 1,000-yard run. He also served a claim of foul. Jerry Nourse of Duke University was the winner of the two-mile run in which Kidd, 18-year-old freshman, set a meet record in 1960.

Kidd, a doubtful starter right up until race time, finished behind Nourse and Pat Traynor of Villanova. The upset of Kidd was expected after a harrowing day he had arrived in mid-afternoon Saturday with an infected blister under a corn on the top of his big toe on the right foot.

He spent several hours in bed, under medical treatment. The blister had become infected Thursday in Toronto, he had lanced six times and Kidd had received penicillin injections along with poultice treatment. He decided to run and convinced officials that he could go the two-mile route.

On his tender foot, Kidd rated himself off the pace until the last quarter mile. From fourth place, some 10 yards back, he moved into the lead with his floppy-arm style. He thrilled the crowd of nearly 13,000 as he battled Nourse and Traynor for the lead which changed hands several times. In close quarters Kidd took a pounding from Traynor's elbows.

With the sounding of the bell, Nourse, never a winner in major competition, sprinted to home to beat Traynor by two yards in 8:59.8. Nourse's time was well off the 8:49.2 clocking Kidd posted in his victory here last year. Kidd, plainly worn out from his game effort, gave up the uneven battle in the last 60 yards, jogging in at the finish with a time of 9:06.4.

The 132-pound youngster who holds the U.S. indoor three mile and cross-country championships declined to offer excuse after the race. NO EXCUSES. "I have plenty of alibis but I don't think it was any of them. I just ran poorly." Kidd admitted the infected blister made his whole foot feel "pretty numb" by the time the race was over.

Jack Semple, a Boston trainer who worked with Kidd before the race, said the Toronto runner was "loaded with penicillin to fight off the infection in the toe." Crothers, Canada's 440 and

ARCADIA, Calif. (CP)—Canadian-owned Four-and-Twenty won his second straight rich stakes race in a week Saturday, scoring an easy three-length victory in the \$54,000 San Fernando Stakes at Santa Anita. Johnny Longden brought the Alberta Ranches' four-year-old to the front early in the 1 1/4-mile race cut to a field of five and never gave it up. The victory established Four-and-Twenty as a heavy favorite in his next race, the \$170,000 Santa Anita Maturity Jan. 27. Older times, three through the first half of the race, passed Obsession in the backstretch to finish second. Obsession was third. The Canadian entry covered the distance in 1:48.45 and paid \$3.50, \$2.50 and \$2.25.
