Less than Half Pass U.I. & Provincial Exams

Less than 50 per cent of students writing grade eight provincial examinations in the last school year achieved a pass, according to figures given yesterday by the department of education. Malcolm MacKenzie, said that 46.9 per cent of the 1,700 students who wrote the exams passed.

English history and geography were the subjects that gave the most trouble. The examinations were set and read under the direction of the provincial examining board. Students in Charlottetown schools were not required to write the department tests.
