TCA Jet-Purchase Plans Spark Uproar In House

OTTAWA (CP)—Prime Minister Pearson has announced the Commons Trans-Canada Air Lines will buy six Douglas DC-9 jet aircraft, and touched off a stormy shouting match with Opposition Leader Diefenbaker.

Mr. Pearson read a lengthy statement to the House about TCA's choice of the Douglas aircraft, the prospective work loss for the Canadian Limited plant in Montreal, and the retention of TCA turbo-prop overhaul facilities in Winnipeg. Parts of the DC-9 are to be made by De Havilland Aircraft Company in Toronto.

The DC-9 has two rear-mounted jet engines and will carry passengers at speeds of better than 500 miles an hour. When Mr. Diefenbaker rose to comment on the announcement, an unidentified backbench Liberal shouted a remark about the former government's cancellation of the Avro Arrow supersonic jet fighter program.

Mr. Diefenbaker said that his government had been disappointed for the decision, but it was only recently revealed that

the previous Liberal government under prime minister Louis St. Laurent had decided the Arrow program must be discontinued—and was afraid to make the announcement before the 1957 election.

CALL FOR ORDER

Mr. Pearson jumped to his feet red-faced, and Mr. Diefenbaker waved him down while Speaker A. I. A. Macnaughton called for order, facing each other, until Mr. Diefenbaker gave way. Mr. Pearson said the opposition leader was "neutrally inaccurate."

Mr. Diefenbaker said the government's support of TCA's decision to buy the DC-9 indicated a cabinet split on the subject. "I have been resolved in favor of those who represent Ontario constituents."

"The rudeness of the face of the prime minister is understandable in all the circumstances," he added.

The government's move was supported by New Democratic Party Leader Douglas and Social Credit Leader Thompson. Credit Leader Real Caouette

said the announcement that the order would go to the Toronto plant was "a dose of castor oil" which Quebec would have to take, and that it was accompanied by "a small teaspoon of sugar" for Winnipeg in the decision to continue turbo-prop overhaul work there.

DECISION REVIEWED

Mr. Pearson said TCA's choice of the DC-9 was made after a thorough technical and economic study of five different medium-range jets, "and a thorough review by the government, disclosed no reason for directing TCA to reconsider this decision."

IGNORE HUSBANDS

Business Briefs

OTTAWA (CP)—The number of carloads of railway revenue freight loaded on Canadian lines in the 10 days ended Oct. 31 increased by 11 per cent over the corresponding 1962 figure, the bureau of statistics has reported.

The January-October total of 3,014,254 carloads was fractionally higher than for the same 1962 period.

Generation of electrical energy by plants with a capacity of at least 10,000,000 kilowatt hours a year increased 7.3 per cent in September to 92,232,100 kilowatt hours from 86,640,980 in the same month last year.

Department store sales in the week ending Nov. 2 were valued 8.8 per cent above those in the corresponding period last year. Decreases of 8.8 per cent in the Atlantic provinces and 2.5 per cent in Quebec were more than counterbalanced by increases in the other provinces.
