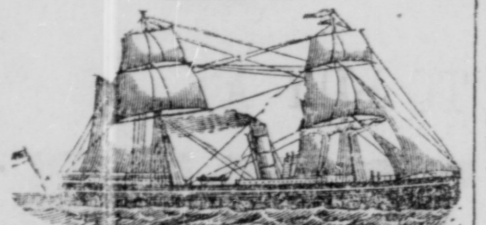

Of Special Interest to our Farmers

The Island Farmer on Exhibitions—
A Conversion.

SIR.—As I am not a frequent reader of the Island Farmer I only lately got a sight of the editor's comments on my letter published in your issue of 13th ult. That editorial fills me with joy mingled with remorse. I rejoice that my letter has been the means of persuading the editor of that paper that agricultural and industrial exhibitions are necessary institutions for promoting improvement in farm methods and for encouraging the breeding of better domestic animals. But my satisfaction in that respect is marred by the evident fact that my letter was too harsh and hurt the feelings of the much respected editor. I humbly apologise. But ask the printer to shoulder his part of the blame, as he printed the word "large" which was written "long."

The editor of the Farmer now consents to the use of balloon ascensions, tight rope and other acrobatic feats, diving girls and horse racing, and judging by a local item he even will permit fire works, and rockets, with a moderate share of artillery, finishing off with pistol practice. So I don't see why, after the above humble acknowledgments, I may not call him a converted brother.

The editor of the Farmer objects to agricultural shows being supported by government grants, as that brings such shows under party patronage. He points out that British cattle shows are supplied with funds by subscriptions made by the great noblemen, land proprietors, members of the royal family and wealthy capitalists. He also complains that the successful Island business man who has made his pile by trading in cattle shows, nor gives any cost towards their support.

Summerside and Prince County business men may deserve that slur. But it is most unjust when applied to the whole Island. The class of men residing in and near Charlottetown, referred to by the Farmer's editorial, have expended nearly forty thousand dollars in land and necessary buildings and adjuncts for holding agricultural shows. For this large outlay they have not received one cent of revenue but have only got the meanest sort of treatment from the local government which the Farmer is ever ready to defend. In Kings County the men who get their profits from the farmer also subscribed handsomely towards exhibition grounds and buildings. Such facts go to prove that the Farmer's editor ought to apologise.

But after the more liberal-minded of the business portion of the community has done its share towards supporting these agricultural gatherings there remains the great mass of the city and country residents whose contributions are needed to help out the show. This is the expectations of the amusement programme. The vast crowds who congregate to see these spectacular attractions are needed for the sake of the gate receipts. They in no way interfere with the proper functions of an agricultural and industrial show. And as the local government is our only rent collector, to whom we pay taxes instead of rent, it is right and proper that it should contribute to the only industry which, can in the long run, be depended on to pay the piper.

Previous to the day of killing they should have had from ten days to two weeks of heavy feeding. Coax them to eat every possible quantity, three-fourths meal and one bran, and fifteen per cent in bulk of the best beet scraps, with an occasional feed of whole corn. If to be sold alive the weight counts, but the fattening will have to be done over as a change of quarters worries the birds, quickly removing the fat and compelling the second fattening, which is always more difficult than the first. They are killed by bleeding in the roof of the mouth and a blow on the head, and are picked substantially the same as a duckling. About half the neck next to the head, also the wings above the first joint, are left unpicked, though the long flight feathers are pulled from the wing. They are marketed with heads on and undrawn, except in midwinter, when many of the western geese are headed, while some are drawn and some are not. When dry picked in warm weather they should be cooled in cold water and much care taken that all the animal heat is expelled before packing for market. In winter a douse in cold water helps the looks and adds to the style of the carcass, but they should be thoroughly dried before packing.—George H. Pollard, in Reliable Poultry Journal.
