 NEW YORK, June 5—French situation continues critical although the securities on the Paris bourse were stronger today, according to Dow Jones. One piece of news this morning that is not particularly favorable is that the Amalgamated Association of iron, steel and mine workers decided last night to affiliate with the committee for organization headed by John L. Lewis. Mr. Lewis has for some time tried to unionize all steel workers so that this new affiliation may mean trouble later on in the steel industry. International Tel and Tel for the first quarter reported 25 cents a share on the common stock. Yesterday's market was not very encouraging. The only thing to say in its favor is that volume did not increase and that the more volatile stocks held rather well. It is probable that the market will be irregular today and tomorrow and unless volume increase materially on the up-side we would continue to defer long commitments.

 MONTREAL, June 5—Further price advances were scored on butter and potatoes on Montreal open produce markets today. Cheese and egg levels held firm and unchanged.  
 Butter was quoted at 21 5-8 to 22 cents a pound for carlots or less or no 1 while lots to retailers were quoted at 23 to 23 1-2 for solids and 23 1-2 to 24 for prints. Cheese was quoted at 12 1-4 to 1-2 cents a pound for no 1 Ontario colored, current arrivals, and white.  
 Graded egg shipments were quoted at 23 cents a dozen for A large 21 1-2 for A medium 20 1-2 for B and 19 1-2 to 20 for C.

**Alleged Confession Of Ambrose Small's Death**  
 (C. P. By Guardian's Special Wire)  
 TORONTO, June 5—A two-page, typewritten document, described as a confession in the slaying of Ambrose J. Small was read into court records yesterday, more than 16 years after the mysterious disappearance of the millionaire theatre owner.  
 The so-called confession allegedly signed by the wife of the man thought last seen alive one blustery night in December, 1919, in downtown Toronto near the old Grand Opera House he owned.  
 The document bore the signature, "T. Small." The wife's name was Theresa Small. She died Oct. 14, 1935, six years after the alleged confession was made.  
 Patrick Small's affidavit, filed also saw Mrs. Small at the Brunswick Avenue home the same day and that she asked to see Patrick Sullivan, who had acted as investigator for Miss Small.  
 "They left the sitting room and went toward another room," Patrick Small attested, "Sullivan returned. I asked him, 'What does the old devil want?' Sullivan informed me that she had signed a confession admitting that she was implicated in the murder of her husband."  
 Browne and Patrick Small appeared last week with Sullivan before special examiner T. T. Rolph. It was then claimed that Mrs. Theresa Small came to the house, where Sullivan also lived, and there signed the reputed confession while Browne looked over her shoulder.  
 The document was then taken away, Sullivan claiming he again saw it six years later, shortly after Mrs. Small's death. It was brought back to the house by a woman he said would appear for the trial. Since delivering the document, he maintained, the woman phoned him once and said she was going to Buffalo. The alleged confession of Mrs. Small said the document was typed by a very dear friend of mine who will deliver it after my death."
