### IN THIS CORNER Touchdown Disputed

### St. Dunstons Defeats P. W. C.

St. Dunstons University football team defeated Prince of Wales College 42-0 yesterday afternoon in the second exhibition encounter of the season.  
The Saints started off in high gear and Tookie, their fullback, scurried through the middle of the line for a gain of twenty yards on the first play. Several plays later Paul Arsenault took a handoff from Quarterback Collins and went into the end zone for scoring.  
Collins, who had a perfect day in the kicking department, converted it and the attention of the Saints' defence and the Saints' job field general made good on all six of the kicks he took after touchdowns.

The Welshmen failed to advance the ball even for a first down and MacDougall swept around the end for a first down for the Saints. Tookie, a Minto, New Brunswick boy took it through the middle of the line for another first down and Collins went into the end zone on an end run for a gain of ten yards. His kick made it 14-0.  
Paul Arsenault got the third touchdown of the game and went across the line unopposed as a nice bit of deception by Collins faked a handoff to his left and slipped the ball to Arsenault who cut to the right and scored. That was 20-0 and Collins kicked the extra point to make it 21-0.

The Saints kicked off to open the second half and Tookie kicked a long one into the end zone. The Welshman ran it out but failed to make a first down and the Saints took over.  
Bladeau scored the Saints fourth touchdown when he took a lateral from Collins and swept around the left end and again Collins converted to make the score 28-0.  
Tookie and Bouchard both went for first downs early in the third quarter. Tookie ran through the line for his and Bouchard scampered around left end. Several plays later Bouchard went around the end for a touchdown and Collins' kick made it 34-0.

**PRINCE OF WALES PLAYERS**  
Prince of Wales College tried a forward and Bladeau intercepted at center field. On the next play the Saints tried a forward and Hugh MacLean, the P.W.C. quarterback, intercepted it.  
The Saints got a couple of first downs in rapid-fire order when McIntyre went through the line for a gain of five yards and Bouchard ran for a gain of thirty yards.

Prince of Wales suddenly stiffened their defense to hold the Saints and take over the ball. They made a first down in two plays along the ground. They followed up with a 20-yard run by Bobby Boyd.
