Simmer 4 hours, or until tender. Cool slightly. Remove skin; reserve (see Chef). Skin off fat from juices in casserole. Slice chicken; serve with gravy. Accompaniment: Soft Rice.

Mix together shortening and cream cheese. Sift together flour and salt and work into first mixture with fork. Transfer to lightly floured surface and pat together to form ball. Roll 1/3 inches thick. Fit into bottom of lightly oiled 7 x 11 inch shallow pan. Cover with apricots, rounded up, making even rows; sprinkle with lemon juice. Pour over sour cream. Dust with extra confectioners' sugar. Serve warm; set in squares.
