

# A.G. Scott Wins Free-For-Ail At Saturday Night Racing Meet

A. G. Scott, Rajah Hanover, Arionway and Abner McGraw raced to double heat victories Saturday night in a keenly contested racing card at the Charlotteville Driving Park.

Lorne Letcher's A. G. Scott, driven by Ike Moreside, continued his great pacing performance as he won both dashes of the Free-For-All with terrific stretch drives.

Rajah Hanover, also driven by Moreside, who reined four winners on the night's card, nosed out Mighty Deb in the Classified Trot and Pace for upset victories in the fourth and eighth races.

Abner McGraw showed too much trotting ability to win easily over Eva Budlong and Buddy O'Connor in the Classified Pace while Arionway trotted to two wins over Wait N' See, Babe Britton almost sprang an upset in the first dash of the Free-For-All as he raced A. G. Scott down to the wire in a battle for the honors. The Babe, driven by Len O'Meara and showing his best form of the season, was leading the field as he headed into the stretch on the last time around and was only nosed out after A. G. Scott moved up rapidly on the outside.

Direct Mite led the field at the half way mark followed by Josefade Clipper, Babe Britton and A. G. Scott. The Babe moved into the lead on the back stretch but didn't have quite enough to stay ahead of the Scott horse.

A. G. Scott, Direct Mite and the Babe waged another stirring battle in their second dash. As they headed into the stretch it was the Babe, Direct Mite and A. G. Scott in that order but once more the Scott horse moved up on the outside to win by half a length over Direct Mite who in turn had half a length on Babe Britton.

But it was Rajah Hanover and Mighty Deb who waged the most thrilling track battle of the night and it came in the last race on the card.

The Rajah took an early lead in the race followed by Mighty Deb in second position and Miss Commando in third. It was still that way as they headed into the stretch and down towards the wire in an all-out race for honors.

Mighty Deb moved slightly ahead of the Rajah on the stretch but somewhere in the last 40 yards the Hanover gelding with all the racing blood of his famous ancestors made up the difference and won by the slightest of margins in a blanket finish.

A photo was required to determine the winner and it showed that the Rajah won because he had his head held high as he crossed the wire.

In their first race the Rajah went away in top position and stayed out front all the way. Mighty Deb, who got away to a poor start, finished second.

Elwood Shaw had an easy time driving Abner McGraw to victories in the Classified Pace. In both races the class McGraw horse went into early leads and was never threatened.

Harold Cudmore also led from wire to wire in winning the Classified Trot. Washmark came up from eighth position to make a strong challenge in the first race but was supplanted in the second race but didn't have quite enough to overcome Arionway.

The daily double on Arionway and Rajah Hanover paid \$82.20 while the quinella on Abner McGraw and Eva Budlong paid \$10.90.
