IN THE HOME WORKSHOP



This project is an interesting one as a few scraps of material quickly develop into a plaything that will delight a youngster. First cut the wheel five inches in diameter from solid stock. Then cut the shafts twenty-seven inches long and position them on the wheel and saw the bottom and top to fit. Each duck takes about fourteen square inches of thin plywood. The pattern will be useful in tracing the ducks. Also it gives the exact shape and position for the various colors to be used in finishing. Details include a list of materials, progressive steps in construction and painting. Price of pattern 258 is 35c. 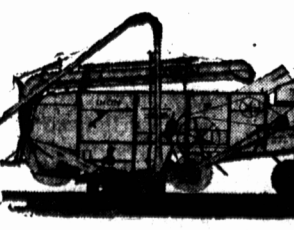

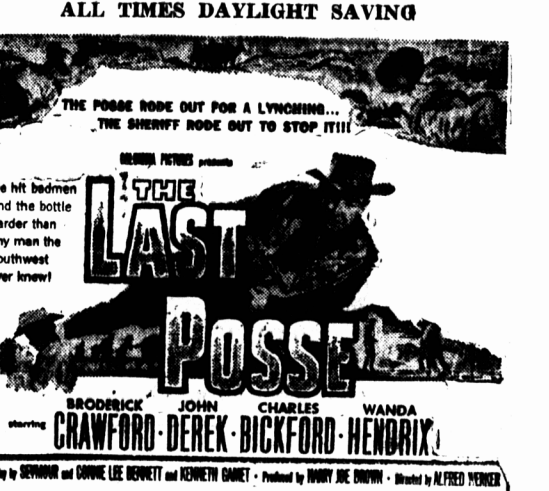
