TIMMINS, Ont., Oct. 28 - (CP) -
A man who is believed by police
to be king-pin of a stolen car
racket in Eastern Canada has been
arrested here by Ontario Provin-
cial Police.

Police said that Gerald Melan-
son, 29, who said he was born in
Moncton, N. B., boasted of having
"stolen over 200 cars" before his
arrest.

When arrested, he was driving a
stolen car bearing stolen licence-
plates and registered in the name
of Adelaide Bussiere of Dubleau,
Que. The car was identified as
belonging to a drive-yourself
company.

Viscount Alexander

OTTAWA, Oct. 29 - (CP) -
The Prime Minister's Office an-
nounced Saturday an extension of
the term of Viscount Alexander
as Governor-General of Canada.

The announcement said the King
has approved an extension for an
additional year from the spring of
1951.

Viscount Alexander became a
Governor-General in 1946.

The statement quoted Prime
Minister St. Laurent as saying he
was sure the people of Canada
"generally will share the gratifica-
tion of his colleagues and himself
that Lord and Lady Alexander
have found it both pleasing and
convenient to agree to this ex-
tension of their stay in Canada."

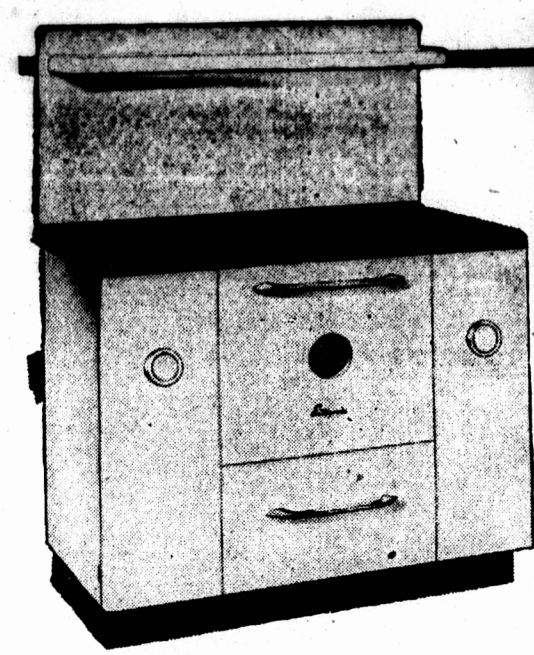

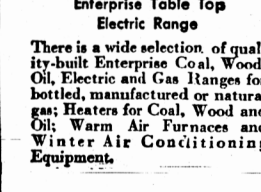
