Hon. M.L. Bonnell Delivers Address

Directors of the P.E.I. Tourist Association were told Wednesday night by Hon. M.L. Bonnell, minister of tourist development, that now is the time for everyone to plan for the future as the day was in sight when tourism would be the top industry in the province.

Dr. Bonnell was a guest of the directors at a 'briefing' session which the association offers for a new department head. It was preceded by a dinner at the Charlottetown Hotel during which the new minister met the various directors and was also attended by George Fraser director of the Travel Bureau.

TRAINING SCHOOLS

The Minister outlined some of the plans of his department and said they included a training school for the girls hired each summer to staff the various travel bureaus. He expressed the opinion the matter of water pollution was a serious one, but said the new Water Authority was now on the move to combat it and he anticipated an improvement in the near future. He also said the government was moving in the direction of having all old car bodies — now lying as eyesores beside roadways — out of the way soon as a part of the provincial participation in the 1967 Centennial program.

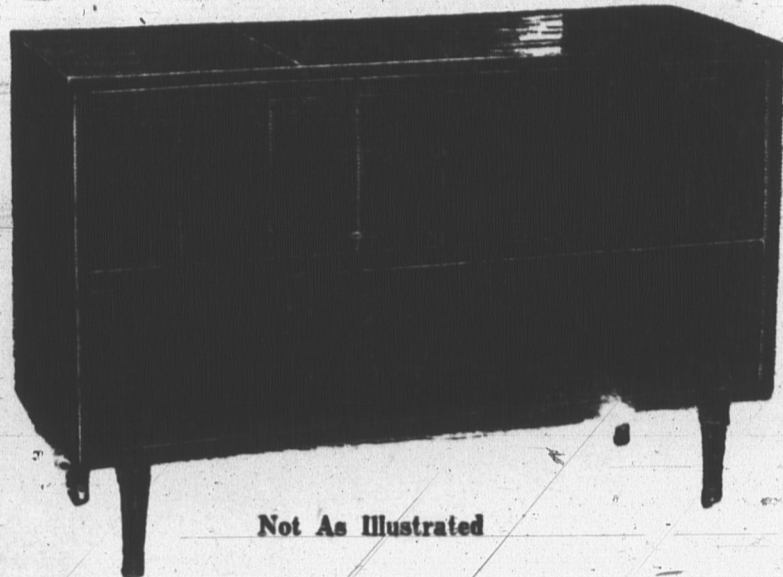
