There have been several disastrous freshets, besides that at Buffalo. In the river St. John, above Fredericton, N. B. much destruction of property, attended with the loss of some lives, have resulted from the ice suddenly breaking up. On the river Susquehanna, U. S.—it is said that the loss of life and property from the deluge, has been incalculable.

From Jamaica.—H. M. ship Athol, arrived at Barbadoes in the latter part of January with near four hundred persons on board, and the small pox prevailing. There had been few deaths however.

REPEAL.—The desire for repeal—for self government, (says the Cape Breton Spirit of the Times,) is not wholly dormant in this community.—At the request of a number of most influential citizens, a Public Meeting has been appointed by the Sheriff to take place on Monday the 6th April.
