GLACE BAY, N.S. (CP)—Widow Greaves won't be a fighter with steady body punches and then finished the young Greaves by hitting him around here Saturday night to retain the Canadian lightweight title. Greaves came back from apparent trouble to pound the 21-year-old Richardson a few minutes earlier, but he was a fighter senseless before the ship was stopped at 2:32 of the scheduled seven round championship fight. About 7,000 fans, mostly of them solely for the challenge, were drawn by Greaves' outburst in the 10th as he put Richardson down four times to win on a technical knockout.

Richardson was not in hospital but was pronounced dead and released at noon Sunday. Greaves, a rugged fighter who never stops swinging, said he was surprised at Richardson's strength and determination. "He's a real good boy," he said.
