Local and Other Items.

BYERS WINS—George Byers, the colored boxer, defeated Jack Burke at Boston a few nights ago. Byers is a Charlottetonian.

BOYS WANTED—Boys are making money selling THE DAILY EXAMINER. It is no trouble for a smart boy to make a fair amount of pocket-money each evening. Boys should be on hand at the office each afternoon at four o'clock.

LACK OF FIRE ESCAPES—According to the coroner's jury the loss of so many lives in the Webster Hotel fire at Montreal lately was due to the lack of fire escapes. The owners of the hotel were censured for not having the property provided with escapes as required by the provincial and municipal law.

THE PRIZE RING—The receipts of the Skarkey-Jeffries contest were \$66,848. Of this amount the fighters fought for two-thirds, or 44,564. As the winner Jeffries received three-quarters of that amount, amounting to \$33,423, Skarkey's share was \$11,141. Jeffries share of the receipts is the largest ever received by a prize fighter for winning a battle.

BIG INHERITANCE TAX—The New York papers figure up a State inheritance tax on the late Cornelius Vanderbilt of over \$1,200,000, and a federal inheritance tax, under the war revenue act, of over \$2,700,000. The total sum is three times the amount of Mr Vanderbilt's public bequests. The State forces a larger contribution of the kind than he would voluntarily make.

SCOLDING WOMEN DEFENDED—Scolding women in Philadelphia have a champion in Judge Finletter, of the municipal court in that city, before whom Maud Levey was arraigned for being a common scold. In Maud's case he put himself on record as a champion of women in general, and particularly of those who are prone to use their tongues to their own advantage. "I will not try any woman for being a common scold," said the judge. "A woman's tongue is a common weapon of offence and defence, and she is entitled to have the use of it." The judge would not hear the case, and witnesses were discharged indefinitely.

THEIR FIGHTING STRENGTH—A statement of the fighting strength of the two Boer states in South Africa, "derived from the best authority," fixes the war strength of the Transvaal at 26,500 burghers, liable to service, of whom 14,200 are between eighteen and thirty-four years of age. The number liable to service in the Orange Free State is stated as 20,000, and the only permanent troops maintained, a force of eighty field artillerymen. "Truth" says: "The gross total on paper comes to 46,500 for the two states, of whom probably about 25,000 are able-bodied men, in the prime of life. The latest estimate of the war strength of Great Britain is 683,770 troops, which can be swelled to 1,168,470 from India and Canada." In view of the possibilities, however, remote they may be judged, of the present war leading to trouble outside of Africa, it is to be borne in mind that, in addition to her military strength, Great Britain possesses a navy equal to that of any two other powers combined.
