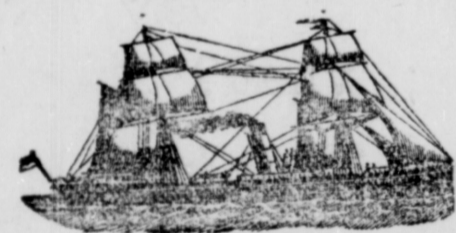

**From Yesterday's 5 o'clock Edition.**

LONDON, May 17.—A despatch to the Standard from Corronna says: "The presence of the British channel squadron at Villagarcia is likely to lead to some unpleasantness."

The idea of an Anglo-American Alliance has so inflamed the Spaniards that the postmen from the fleet when on shore to collect letters have been hooted and stoned. Threats have been made to stop the supply of provisions for the fleet.

The British Consul protested to the Alcalde who explained that the popular resentment was due to a belief in the existence of an alliance, and further to the impression that the fleet took wheat that properly belonged to the poor.

KEY WEST, May 17.—The ships of the American blockading fleet are keeping a vigilant watch for the appearance of the Spanish fleet and will not be taken by surprise.

Should Spain's men-of-war put in an appearance all the ships have been warned by Commander Watson of such a move and sailors are kept constantly in tops where they can sweep the horizon for thirty miles looking out for first sign of hostile ships.

NEW YORK, May 17.—A special to the World from Madrid says that Admiral Cerveras' fleet will move about in the Caribbean Sea and the Gulf of Mexico.

It is expected by the naval men here that Cerveras will avoid a fight in case he finds himself overmatched.

His chief aim is to draw the American squadron away from the Cuban coast, so that he may make a dart and get into Havana.

Great expectations are founded upon a night raid by Spanish torpedo boat destroyers upon the American blockading squadron.

Later, when the rainy season sets in, the blockade runners, both Spanish and foreign, will undertake to carry ammunition and provisions to Cuba and Porto Rico.

NEW YORK, May 17.—A special to the World from London says: "The Russian ambassador has been directed to demand of Lord Salisbury an explanation of Chamberlain's assertion that Russia is ineligible for an alliance because of her perfidy."

WASHINGTON, May 17.—The Navy Department issued the following bulletin at the close of office hours yesterday, embodying such official information of the day as the Department regarded proper for publication:

"Admiral Dewey was informed that officers, men and supplies would be sent out to Manila by the City of Pekin. About 1200 troops will go."

Mr. Knight, the correspondent of the London Times, having received the necessary permission from the Spanish Government to land at Havana, if conveyed to that port by a neutral vessel, has been granted permission by the Navy Department to take passage by the German steamer Polaria which vessel is given permission to pass the blockade.

The department hopes to make an exchange of prisoners at an early date.

The Austrian man-of-war The Empress Maria Teresa will visit Cuban ports.

CORACOA, May 17.—The Spanish squadron under Admiral Cervera, which left here last evening after the cruisers Vizcaya and Infanta Maria Teresa had taken on about two hundred tons of coal and a great quantity of provisions, has not been sighted today.

When the squadron disappeared it was going westward.

LONDON, May 17.—The Paris correspondent of the Daily Mail says: "A number of Spanish war vessels, which were recently destitute of armament, have been supplied with Krupp guns."

They have also been supplied with all the necessaries including German artillery.

MADRID, May 17.—The Marquis Vega D'Armigo, president of the Chamber, has advised Senor Sagasta to end the crisis as quickly as possible.

Senor Montero Rios, President of the Senate, has offered his support, but does not desire to enter the new Cabinet.

Senor Gamaseo, who is ill, also declines to enter the Cabinet, but he promises to support any ministry organized by Senor Sagasta. The general impression is that the Cabinet crisis will be protracted.

LONDON, May 17.—A despatch to the Daily Telegraph from St. Petersburg says:

Japan intends to protest vigorously against America seizing the Philippines.

She has already sought the assistance of Russia and conference are occurring between Count Muravieff the Russian Foreign Minister and the Japanese Ambassador, Baron Hayashi Tadace.

It is believed that France and Germany will support Japan.

MONTREAL, May 17.—The Montreal Star publishes an article asserting that there are grave reasons for believing that Senor Polo y Bernabe, ex-Ambassador to the United States, has been conducting an extensive bureau of secret information, called by the United States a spy system with headquarters in Montreal.

The results of investigations are in the hands of the Chief of the United States Secret Service.
