CAMPBELLTON, N.B. (CP) — Rolland Baptiste Poirier, 32, of nearby Matapedia, Que., died in a fire in a motel unit here late Saturday night. Police said the man apparently died of asphyxiation after the bed in which he was sleeping burst into flames. Apparently a cigarette caused the fire, but the incident was still under investigation. The fire was confined to one unit of the motel annex of the Brunswick Hotel. Coroner Dr. H.M. Rice ordered an autopsy. No decision has been made as to an inquest.

Home & School Ass'n Asks Dentist For Area

TIGNISH — The monthly meeting of the Tignish Home and School Association was held recently in the regional high school auditorium with the president, Gerald Handrahan, chairing the meeting. Secretary Sister Saint Angela Marie read the minutes of the previous meeting. The meeting discussed the possibility of acquiring a dentist for Tignish. It was agreed the matter should be pursued immediately. The financial report was given by the treasurer Mrs. Russell Perry who also reported 100 paid members. Mrs. Alcide Boudreault reported for the school life committee. Mrs. Will Boyce for entertainment. A report from the semi-annual meeting on "Guidance" was given by Mrs. Adriac Doucette. Sister Saint Mary Arnold, school principal, called upon to speak on the subject, stated guidance isn't just to help the child decide his role in life, but guidance pertains to the whole child. A guidance director, she said, takes all the different phases of a child's life into consideration. A child at the end of grade eight, she said, does not know the difference between academic school and vocational school, therefore he should spend a year in grade nine. **DIRECTOR NEEDED** Sister Mary Arnold, through the year, interviews each student in the high school and tries to do what she can concerning their problems. But her teaching duties, prevent her from spending the necessary time in this field. It was the feeling of several of the teaching staff that a guidance director is a need. Canada's Home and School Centennial project for 1967 was discussed and projects thought to be the most important were selected by the meeting to be sent to provincial for further consideration. Russell J. Perry spoke on the motor mechanics and welding course that is now underway at Tignish and Alberton. Giving credit to Mr. Sudsbury, instructor from the Charlottetown Vocational School, he said great interest is apparent in this course by the students.

Minister Moves To New Parish

ALBERTON — Rev. M. R. Ness has left Alberton to become rector of the Anglican Parish of Crapaud. Six years ago last month Mr. Ness came to minister to St. Peter's Parish which included the congregations at Alberton, O'Leary, Alma and Kildare Capes. 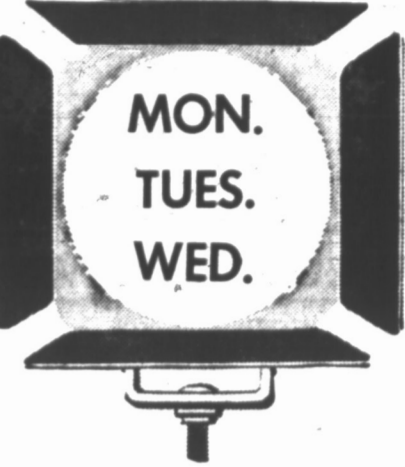
BUST BY PRISONERS
