**Liberal Leader Stresses Mar. Economic Union**

Provincial Liberal Leader A. W. Matheson said Wednesday that too much emphasis is being placed on parliamentary union of the Atlantic Provinces and more stress should be placed on economic union. There would be definite economic advantages to a union with the Atlantic Provinces, he said.

Mr. Matheson said that in 1950, while he was premier of this province, the matter of union came up at several Atlantic provinces' conferences. "It was a matter of course," he said, "that a number of programs could be set up to save money by the governments involved. Two programs that I recall suggesting were uniformity of road signs and uniformity of school text books."

Mr. Matheson said that about the only good thing that came out of suggestions of Atlantic union was the formation of the Atlantic Provinces Economic Council.

It was suggested by Mr. Matheson that Premier Walter R. Shaw's remarks about Atlantic Union, brought up at last month's premiers' conference in Halifax, were "a bit premature." The premier suggested that the people of the province and members of the provincial legislature should examine the union suggestion "fully before any study was made."

Mr. Matheson said "I would have gone right after Premier Robichaud and Stanfield who have expressed much interest in the idea and asked just what each has in mind, such as how would union be handled, what advantages would there be to the whole area and what advantages would there be to this province."

According to Mr. Matheson, present talks on Atlantic union are definitely advantageous but "I think too much stress is being put on the parliamentary union angle. I think it should be a self-service union. We have to find how we can help each other economically."
