Spy On Cuba From Space, Nikita Says

PARIS (AP)—Soviet Premier Khrushchev was described by a former U.S. senator Friday as believing that the United States should get adequate aerial inspection of Cuba from space and thus avoid any new crisis in the Caribbean.

William Benton, former Democratic senator from Connecticut, talked with Khrushchev Thursday at the Kremlin. Benton gave his impressions of Khrushchev's views upon his arrival in Paris. He is the U.S. envoy to the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) which has its headquarters here.

Benton quoted Khrushchev as saying Soviet spacemen have brought back photographs of American military installations and he assumes U.S. spacemen did the same in regard to the Soviet Union.

Benton told reporters today that Khrushchev apparently was suggesting that the U.S. abandon reconnaissance plane flights which might encounter Cuban anti-aircraft fire. President Johnson has said such flights are necessary and will be continued.
