Utilizing the results of countless success stories in the United States, Donald Gordon of A. Dickard Machinery Ltd., and Bradabane general contractor, Donald J. Barlow, have completed land treatment work on more than 150 acres on various farms throughout the Island...

Andrew MacRae, provincial minister of agriculture, accompanied Mr. Gordon on an extensive tour of several farms in Georgia and other sections of the Southern United States in the spring of this year...

While in the U.S., Mr. MacRae was shown the results of the many land restoration and preservation programs which have been conducted there...

REGAN IN JUNE
Mr. Gordon, benefitting from these findings, contacted Mr. Barlow and the two worked out economical plans to aid P.E.I. farmers...

Beginning in early June of this year, contractor Barlow, using heavy equipment, has provided, through land clearing, 13 island farmers a total of 755 acres of workable land and has subdivided another 75 acres on another six farms...

Latest reports following the completion of the majority of this land treatment in late September, show that land clearing can be completed in a reasonable price range of from \$60 to \$125 per acre, depending on how heavily the field is infested with bush and underbrush...

Subsiding, a dependable procedure for reducing the moisture near the surface of the soil, ranged from only \$10 to \$15 per acre and need be done only once every seven years...

The 13 farmers who now have workable, productive land where ailer bushes and brush formerly prevailed, were "given" this land in most cases in less than two days...

Mr. Barlow, who also used his heavy equipment for many road building jobs for the P.E.I. Department of Highways, was kept busy during the summer at a total of 18 farms from Brudenell to Crapaud...

Using a clearing blade on the front of his Caterpillar tractor, Barlow moved into many severe brush infested fields formerly prime crop and pasture, and sheared everything at ground level to produce workable land in a short period of time...

SEEDS NEXT DAY
An example of his land clearing work can be seen on the farm of George Nicholson of Crapaud where he cleared three and a half acres in a single day in the spring of this year...

Mr. Nicholson was able to move onto the land the following morning with a cultivator, work his soil and seed in it on that same day...

In the fall of this year, Mr. Nicholson was able to realize a healthy crop from land which he had previously considered as waste...

Two other island farmers who had considerable land clearing work done on their farms were Waldron Cameron of Albany who now has 14 more acres of productive land and James Ca...
