Steelworkers Aided In Bid To End Wage Differential

TORONTO (CP)—Canadian steelworkers bidding to wipe out wage differentials with their United States counterparts got a public boost Thursday from I. W. Abel, president of the big United Steelworkers of America.

Mr. Abel, here for the first Canadian meeting of the USWA international board in its 30-year history, told a news conference the union hopes to achieve Canada-U.S. parity in certain operations such as basic steel just as it wiped out the "southern differential" in the U.S. several years ago.

Control Efforts Being Made To Handle Traffic In LSD

Efforts now are being made by the federal Food and Drug Directorate to draft legal controls on trafficking and possession of LSD.

MONTREAL (CP)—A recent survey of high school students, carried out by the Canadian Chamber of Commerce, produced statistics which, the organization says, indicate that high school students have a better understanding of Canada's business system than the general public.

Forest Fires Controlled

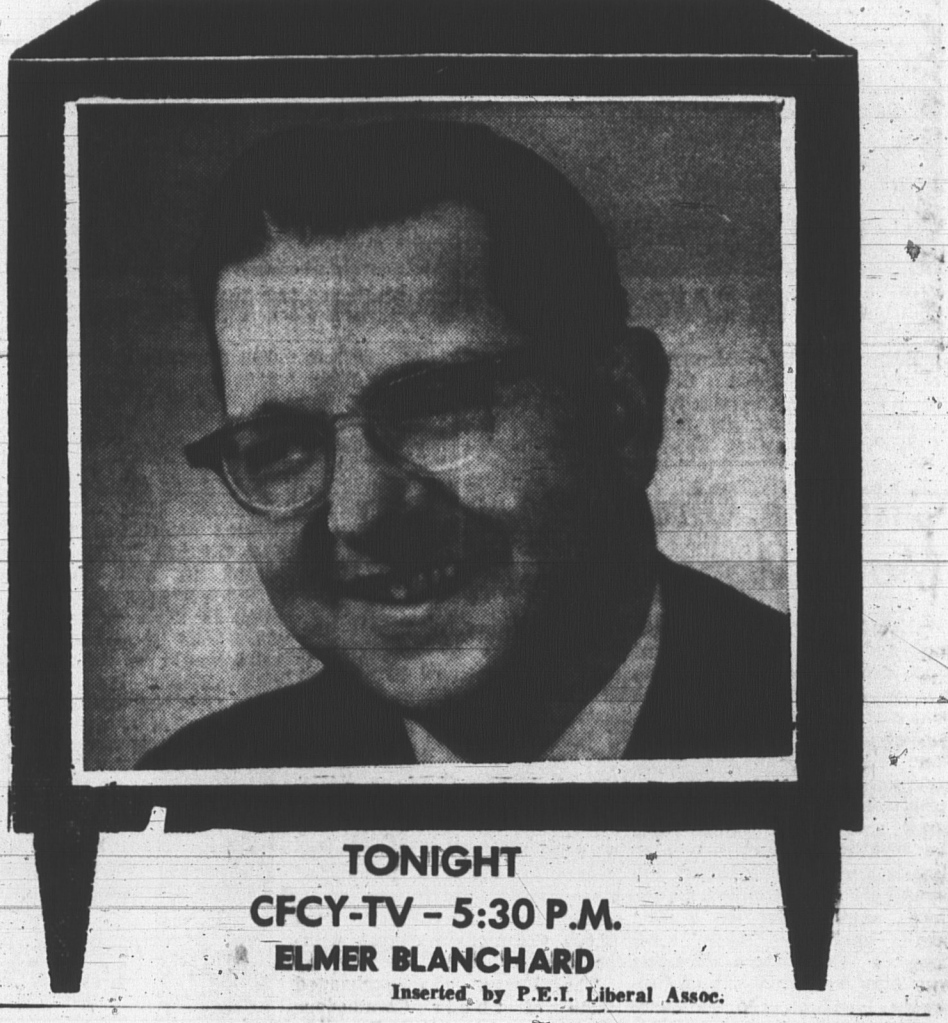
