#### Imported Canned Ham Is Delicious Budget-Buy

"HERE I have a fine budget buy that can be prepared with real gourmet overtones, Madame," remarked the Chef. "A large five-pound imported, canned Polish ham, good to the last scrap, and what fine flavor. "As these hams are boned and trimmed, this is enough meat to provide three entrees for six persons.

**BAKED GLAZE HAM**  
"For our dinner for guests I will bake-glaze this whole Polish ham with fruits and nuts, to serve hot or cold. There may be some oddments left from the carving, also the aspic, which I shall treasure in jars."

**LOAF**  
"The next day I had quarter-inch slices of ham dusted with flour, salt and pepper, laid in a low casserole, covered with six slices peeled white potatoes, onion salt and more salt and pepper, neatly covered with three cups heated milk seasoned with one teaspoonful table mustard and slow-baked for one hour.

**GREEN BEANS GARNISH**  
"The garnish will be cooked fresh green beans rolled in grated Parmesan.

"Along with the ham casserole I shall bake a casserole of apple sauce for a side dish of dessert."

"As to the ham and oddments that are left, Chief," I said, "I'd like to make them into a rye party sandwich loaf to serve with coffee after bridge later in the week."

Measurements are level **BAKED APRICOT - GLAZED HAM**

1 1/4 or 5 lb. Imported canned Polish ham  
1 cup apple juice  
1-3 cup honey  
1 tablespoon maraschino cherry juice  
1 tablespoon lemon juice  
1 pound dried apricots (soaked 2 hours in water to cover)  
About 2 dozen blanched large almonds

Dip canned ham in boiling water to loosen gelatin.  
Open can as directed. Turn a sharp knife around edge. Run ham into oiled loaf baking pan. Score top fat.  
Bake 20 minutes to the lb., at 325 degrees F., basting twice with apple juice.  
At end of 1 hour, brush ham with the honey mixed with
