

General Council Report

There was a General Council Meeting held on Wednesday, Nov. 12th at 3:00 P.M. at The Barn. The meeting was not well attended, although it was well advertised and open to all students. It is hoped that the next meeting will have better attendance. Here are the minutes for those interested.

Don Perry was a guest from the National Union of Students - Eastern Representative. John McAleer requested he give his report first. Audit - Lost money in most everything in '79-80. Fall Fest - profit \$189. Finnigan - Loss \$688. Orientation - Loss \$150. Panther Lounge - 1979 Profit of \$5000. Last year \$287 loss. Second semester attributed to loss, Pigs didn't go over well. -Radio Station \$5000 loss. Social Com. \$312. profit. Sun - \$6,700 loss. Winter Carnival \$411 loss. Yearbook \$1,938 loss. Overall Revenue \$86,352. Expend. 114,809. Loss 28,557.

Student asked how this year was going and how much student fees brought in. McAleer stated to date it looks like \$2,200 profit and \$82,000 SU fees. 1354 students.

McAleer - Hopes of Yearbook breaking even due to increase in prices. Hopes of \$2000 profit for Panther Lounge. Anyone who wants to go through audit is more than welcome.

Student inquired about camera? Brown stated Council gave authority to spend \$625. on new camera. Since D. Banks quit his job on Photo Club, Todd McLaughlin & Ellen McLean looking after it, so may not want to purchase camera.

McAleer - Hope to set aside money for Capital Savings Bond due to recommendations from university, as SU owes the university money. University will forgive debit if money is set aside for this Bond each year.

MacKenzie - Comptrollers Report - Run down of Barn operations for Summer: Maintenance & Repairs \$2884. Painting, new rug, shingles) - Water \$94.32. -Sanitation \$96.60. -Communications (Radio Project) grant from gov't. -New Walkway. Parlee - Vice-President gave

report on different clubs. Social Committee - doing good this year. Brown - President's Report - Sat on Sport Complex Committee - things still in dream stage. - There is a Main Bldg. renovation committee. -John Mc is sitting on Finance Committee. - Ottawa Conference - McAleer & Brown represented

UPEI. They were there for info on what would happen if UPEI joined the NU of S.

- Alex Smith, Nanci Waugh, Philip Brown plus one Faculty member for a committee for coat of arms for UPEI

- committee appointed to look into advantages of evaluation of faculty members.

-Things are looking okay so far, but we need support

Don Perry - National Union of Students. It is a union owned and controlled by students. NUS represents many post-secondary students, and works on the problems of students, such as student aid, summer employment, declining enrollment etc. NUS was formed in 1973.

Mix up in Personnel Board

One candidate who applied for one of the five job openings as Campus Police was not interviewed by the Personnel Board.

Brian King had submitted an application to the Personnel Board, but was unavailable for the Nov. 7 interviews.

According to Holly MacDonald, Head of the Personnel Board, he was in the building during the interviews, but sent a message saying that he could not attend.

MacDonald also said that the members of the Board agreed to meet again on November 12th to interview King. At noon, Wed., Nov. 12th, King said he was informed of the 12:20 meeting. Although he did attend, only 2 members of the Personnel Board appeared.. Both MacDonald and King feel that the discrepancy was due to a miscalculation between all concerned. King said that he did not feel that personal reasons played a part in the failure to interview him.

MacDonald stated that she tried to arrange another meeting, but the members of the Board were unable to get together due to circumstances beyond their control. She said that the students on the personnel board at this time of year, are extremely busy with course work and deadlines and are often unable to meet.

MacDonald also strongly recommended that King submit his application after X-Mas for consideration again. She is also willing to accept full responsibility for the mix-up. However, King does not blame the personnel board for the confusion, but still feels that he should get an interview.

Two other members of the personnel board also said

that they believe King was a victim of circumstances.

Mary Driscoll said "I admit that we were in the wrong because everyone who applies for a position, should get an interview".

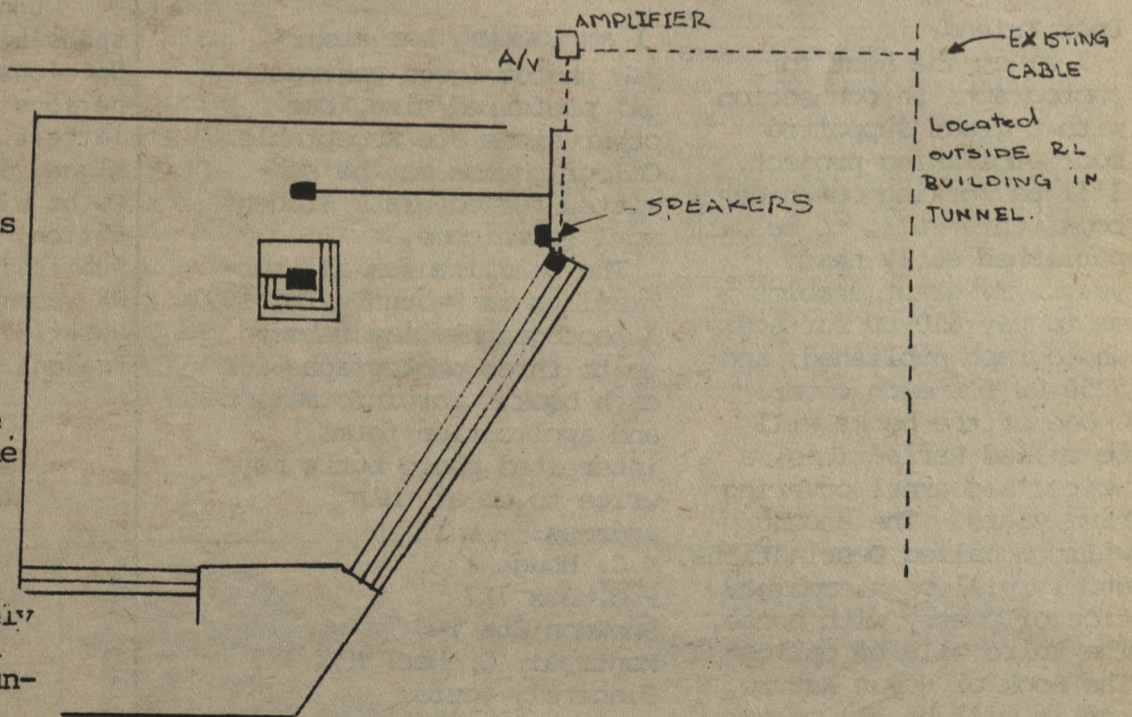
Chris MacKinnon said that the board did their best to have the interview, but he felt that the long weekend was a bad time to have the interview.

MacKinnon feels that the board should setup times available for inter-

views as soon as positions are needed. Applicants should state the best time for them and the interviews should be longer than 10 minutes.

Driscoll feels that the personnel board could play an important role at UPEI if it was operated effectively. She believes that the personnel board needs a set format with standardized questions, procedures and interviews to prevent future mix-ups.

Presenting CIMN in the Library Lounge



The above diagram is the proposed sound system for Robertson Library Lounge, as put forward by the UPEI ENGINEERING SOCIETY. The cost breakdown is as follows:

- 1 Mono Amplifier (Radio Shack) \$100.
- 2 Speakers (Radio Shack) \$ 40.
- Miscellaneous (Caulking Compound, drills, screws, etc.) \$ 20.
- 300 Feet of Cable ---Donated

by Island Telephone Co.

The labour for the installation will be donated by the Engineering Society, as well as the A/V Department. A minimum of 12 watts will be required to reproduce the CIMN signal. The amplifier will at all times be located in the A/V office.

The sound system is to allow CIMN to reach the ears of Day students as well as Resident students.
