

House Member Convicted In Quebec Election Case

MONTREAL (CP)—Hector Dupuis, 60, Liberal member of the House of Commons for Montreal St. Mary, was sentenced to a fine of \$400 and costs or six months in jail Friday when convicted of illegally registering his wife as a voter in the June 20 provincial election.

Emile Colas, lawyer for Mr. Dupuis, said an appeal will be filed immediately.

Mr. Dupuis had pleaded he was unaware his wife was obliged to live in Quebec province for two years to become eligible to vote in a provincial election. He was married last spring to a resident of Ottawa. The marriage was his second.

Judge Lucien Gendron said Mr. Dupuis' offence was serious since the law called for fines ranging from \$100 to \$500 plus a jail term ranging up to two years. However, he had found a judgment which ruled that the jail term was not

mandatory in such cases.

In the election, Mr. Dupuis' son Yvon unsuccessfully sought re-election as Liberal member of the provincial legislature for Montreal St. Mary's.

MOCK PROVINCIAL LAWS

Addressing Mr. Dupuis, Judge Gendron said:

"Dupuis, I have known you for many years and I doubt that you are a criminal similar to those we see hereabouts every day.

"But if members of Parliament come here and plead ignorance of the law as you have done, then frankly I do not know where we are heading. And I greatly regret that French-Canadians mock in such a manner the laws of their province."

Mr. Dupuis, granted permission to speak, said:

"I wish to recall to you that I pleaded ignorance of the law and that I found it quite natural that my wife, being with me, should

C. N. R. Plans For Montreal Centre

MONTREAL (CP) — Canadian National Railways has completed plans for further development of its "planned" 23-acre property in downtown Montreal.

Webb and Knapp (Canada) Ltd., plans to erect an unspecified number of select office buildings on 4.4 acres of the area. An official estimate of the cost was \$125,000,000.

As a prerequisite, however, the company must submit in six months a master plan for the whole 23 acres. Once that is accepted the company can go ahead with its project on a 99-year lease.

The development must be finished in five years.

The CNR area already includes Central Station, the International Civil Aviation Building and the partly-completed Queen Elizabeth Hotel.

CNR President Donald Gordon Thursday night announced plans for a formal plaza, over a 450-car parking lot, to be called Place Ville-Marie.

The 4.4-acre area is bisected by farm states plus the electoral votes of several big industrial states—Pennsylvania's 31, Ohio's 25 and Michigan's 20 — and he would be in.

the proposed plaza and lies north of Dorchester Street. This route cuts east-west across the CNR property.

Webb and Knapp (Canada) Ltd. was established a year ago with backing by Webb and Knapp, Inc., large New York real estate development firm.

Death Thursday In Montreal Of Hon. Mr. Bovey

MONTREAL (CP) — Hon. Wilfrid Bovey, member of the Quebec legislative council who served as a Canadian staff officer in the First World War and for many years was associated with McGill University and the Canadian Legion, died early Thursday. He was 73.

Mr. Bovey died in Queen Mary Veterans' Hospital, to which he was admitted last June. He had been in ill health since last February.

Mr. Bovey became widely known as an educationalist and author and for his interest in many facets of community life. During the Second World War he served as national chairman of Canadian Legion educational service, which provided educational facilities for 250,000 service men.

A graduate of McGill and Cambridge University, he was called to the English bar (Inner Temple) in 1906 and a year later became a member of the Quebec bar.

WAS ARMY VETERAN

He served overseas with the Canadian forces during the First World War, returning as a lieutenant-colonel. Overseas he served

under the late Gen. Sir Arthur Currie, with whom he later was associated at McGill, and was mentioned several times in despatches.

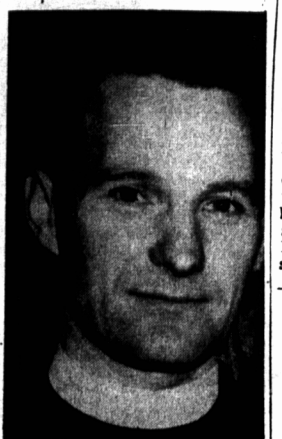
He was associated with McGill from 1923 to 1948, the last eight years as chairman of the extension division.

Mr. Bovey's long association with the Canadian Legion was given specific recognition when he was presented with the Canadian Legion Medal for meritorious service by Admiral Lord Louis Mountbatten on a visit to Montreal.

He also won recognition for his writings. In 1933 he was awarded the David Prize for English literature for his book *Canada: A French-Canadian history and life*. He was also an Officer of the Order of the British Empire and of the Legion d'Honneur Reconnaissance Française.

He was appointed a member of the Quebec legislative council—the upper house—in 1942. In 1948 he was elected president of Reddy Memorial Hospital, Montreal.

Survivors include his widow, the former Eleanor Lily Macklin of Montreal and a son, Cmdr. H. G. Bovey, senior officer, Royal Canadian Navy, Newfoundland.

To Be Evangelistic Preacher On Island

RURAL POLIO IMMUNIZATION CLINIC

Immunization clinics will be held in most of the rural schools from the last week in October to mid November and in some cases in regional centres for surrounding districts. Teachers will be notified of the date and time of the clinics and parents are asked to keep in touch with the teachers for this information. Clinics will NOT be held in the larger rural centres or in Charlottetown and Summerside until the smaller rural school clinics are completed and there is sufficient vaccine available.

ELIGIBLE FOR A POLIO INOCULATION THIS FALL ARE:

1. A 2nd inoculation for ALL PRESCHOOL and SCHOOL CHILDREN who have only received one inoculation to date. This will be mainly the pupils in Grades I & II and in Grades V to VII. (Most of the pupils now in Grades 3 & 4 have already received two doses).
2. A 2nd inoculation for the EXPECTANT MOTHERS, who have received one inoculation and have not as yet had their babies. No certificate is required.
3. A 1st inoculation for the pupils in Grades VIII to X.
4. A 1st inoculation for any other preschool children (born before January 1, 1955, or any school child or expectant mother who has not had a polio inoculation. Expectant mothers must present a certificate from their doctor confirming pregnancy).

No inoculation will be given without the parent's signed request. The forms to be signed (for a FIRST inoculation only) may be secured from the teachers. Parents are requested to return these to the teacher promptly.

OTHER INOCULATIONS AVAILABLE AT THESE CLINICS ARE:

A 3rd or 4th inoculation (as the case may be) against diphtheria, whooping cough and tetanus for any infant who commenced the series of these inoculations this Spring.

A re-inforcing dose against diphtheria, whooping cough and tetanus for these requiring it.

Vaccination against smallpox.
