**Drunk Driver Is Sentenced To Jail Term**

A Charlottetown man, appearing in County Magistrate's Court yesterday morning on a charge of driving while intoxicated, pleaded guilty and received a 10-day jail term.

Fines of \$20 and costs or 30 days were meted out to residents of Souris and Charlottetown appearing on similar charges of having possession of intoxicating liquor at a place other than their residences.

A Charlottetown resident, convicted on a charge of driving a vehicle 70 m.p.h. in a 40 m.p.h. speed zone was fined \$15 and costs or 10 days.

Fines of \$5 and costs or five days were drawn by a Parkdale resident for driving a motor vehicle with defective equipment and an Augustin Cove man for passing another vehicle on the crest of a hill.

Similar fines were drawn by a Union Road man for failure to transfer the registration of a motor vehicle and a Fredericton resident for operating a motor vehicle without number plates.

An East Royalty resident drew a reprimand when he appeared on a charge of failing to register a motor vehicle for the current year. Magistrate Gilbert A. Gaudet, QC, presided.

**Impaired Driver Gets Stiff Fine**

A guilty plea to a charge of driving a motor vehicle while impaired brought a fine of \$150 and costs or 30 days to a Charlottetown resident when he appeared in City Police Court yesterday morning.

The accused was originally charged with driving while intoxicated, but the court accepted his plea of guilty to the lesser offence.

In the only other case before Magistrate K. M. Martin a resident of Southport charged with being drunk and incapable was fined \$20 and costs or 30 days.
