

Space Baby in Moscow Doing Well

MOSCOW (CP)—The world's first "space baby" was reported doing well in Moscow Gynecological Institute Wednesday, two days after her birth to space woman Valentina Nikolayev Terebkhova.

Announcement of the historic birth of the baby girl was made by the Soviet news agency Tass more than an hour after it was unofficially reported by Western press services. Her weight was not announced but unofficial reports placed it at six pounds 13 ounces.

Valentina was also reported doing well.

There were unconfirmed reports that the birth at 2:10 p.m. Monday was by Caesarean section.

Valentina, a 27-year-old blonde, is the wife of space hero Andrian Nikolayev. They were married last Nov. 2 in a widely publicized wedding attended by Premier Khrushchev, who proposed the toast.

INTEREST IN PROGRESS
Scientists throughout the world will be watching the progress of the infant born of the first woman ever to fly in space. Valentina orbited the earth 48 times beginning last June 16, just short of a year before she became a mother. Her capsule was in space in company with that of Lt. Col. Valery Bykovsky, who went around 81 times.

Nikolayev circled the earth 56 times in an earlier Soviet space spectacular in August, 1962. Valentina, a former textile mill worker who was recruited for the Soviet space program after earning her spurs as a part-time parachute jumper, has already disproved one of the more exaggerated theories as to the effect of space flight.

Simply by conceiving and giving birth, she has destroyed the notion, which gained limited currency in some countries, that a woman who had flown through space could not become a mother. If the new baby progresses well, scientists will be reassured as to the effect of space flight on the human organism.

Nikolayev told the Soviet press agency Novosti he was "very happy," adding: "I thank you for your congratulations. I shall convey them to Valya."

Nikolayev, who this week cancelled a goodwill visit to Yugoslavia, said in April that Valentina wanted a girl and would call her Yelena after her widowed mother.

Valentina's hospital room, overlooking a Moscow park, was a blaze of color as flowers poured in from well-wishers throughout the Soviet Union.

U.S. Gangster Is Arraigned

MONTREAL (CP)—Joseph Bonanno, described in court as a prominent United States gangster, was arraigned late Wednesday on a three-count perjury charge arising from his motion for habeas corpus to block deportation.

The warrant for the charge, taken out earlier Wednesday by the RCMP and immigration department, says Bonanno, also known as "Joe Bonanno," lied in the motion when he swore he had been falsely imprisoned by federal authorities.

It says he also committed perjury when he claimed his deportation was subject to appeal or review and that he had not been presented with a written notice of a deportation order.

Preliminary hearing on the perjury charge was set for June 17.

Bonanno, being held in immigration cells, did not apply for bail on the perjury charge. His counsel, Myer Gross, said he would wait until Friday for the court decision on whether Bonanno should be freed on bail in his habeas corpus action.

Weekly Paper To Begin In Ont.
GRAND BEND, Ont. (CP)—A new weekly newspaper, the Grand Bend Holiday, will start publication in this resort area community Friday, the paper's editor and publisher, Wilman D. Dimin, said Wednesday.

The six-column, tabloid-size newspaper will be published only during the summer vacation period and will be distributed free to persons holidaying in the area. Sole revenue will be from advertising.

Grand Bend is 35 miles northwest of London, Ont.

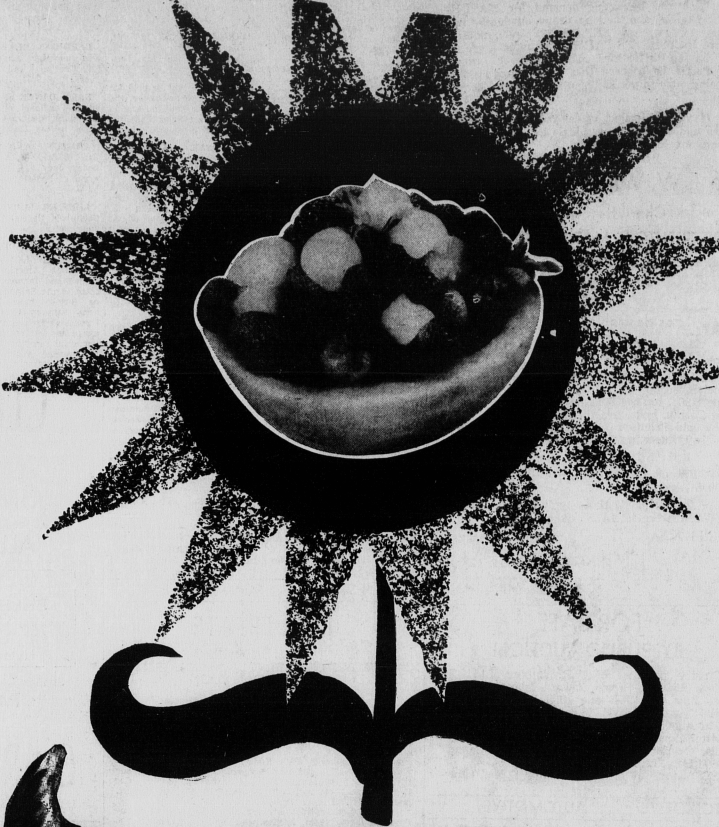
