## Federation Of Agriculture News

### Directors Meet

Last Friday afternoon a joint meeting of the Federation directors from Kings and Queens Counties was held. The membership campaign was reviewed and showed a very satisfactory return although there are several districts to be won yet. It is quite evident that the membership from each County will be much greater than the goals suggested early in the year.

A great deal of interest is evident, judging by the demand from the districts right across the province for local meetings.

Arrangements have been made to hold the general meetings of the County Federations during the latter part of June. Voting delegates from each school district will be expected to attend. The Queens County meeting will be held at Hunter River on June 21st, Prince George County meeting at Summerside on June 22nd and Kings County at Cardigan on the 23rd.

The main program at those meetings will be a discussion on the adoption of the proposed Marketing Scheme. Arrangements are being made to have an expert down to the Island at that time to explain in detail the purpose, operations and successes of similar Boards in other provinces.

The poultrymen may also have a plan to present at that time. Several other questions have been suggested for the agenda mostly dealing with our marketing and livestock problems.

The meeting also suggested that consideration should be given by the farmers to transportation problems. A committee was appointed for each County to arrange the details of those conferences. Both afternoon and evening sessions will be held.

Federation and urging immediate action of an inquiry into the cost of feeds and feed grains in Eastern Canada was passed.

It was felt that because the Government did not accept the specific recommendation of the Canadian Federation when establishing the Canadian Wheat Board, to provide for protection of Eastern farmers and give them preference in obtaining coarse grains from the Western provinces at reasonable rates, was having a serious effect on our whole economy as well as discouraging the production of foodstuffs.

A letter from the C.F.A. office this morning indicates that some announcement will soon be made from Ottawa about this problem. Because of the demand for local meetings, help with organizational problems, and in order to keep up with the expanding work connected with present Federation marketing plans and the program of the Dairyman's Association, it was decided that some extra help was necessary at the present time. The directors felt that if our Federation program is to be successful we must be able to provide assistance, information and help within reason to all districts requiring same.

It was also explained that the present secretary planned on accepting his scholarship and course in the old country and would be leaving during the latter part of September. Although the general feeling is that the Federation should, and eventually will have to maintain a full time fieldman, this is not possible at the present time.

However, arrangements were made to obtain the services of Mr. J.L. Dewar from New Perth, a successful farmer, and experienced in the work of our farm organizations, on a parttime basis for the summer months. It is hoped that Mr. Dewar will be able to take over the duties of secretary in the fall.

It will now be possible to accommodate many districts who have been asking for help recently. There have been nine or ten district meetings held this week. The main discussions centered on marketing. The meetings generally represented from three to six school districts and were exceptionally well attended.

Education Featured

The Provincial Directors held their regular meeting later the same evening. A report from the Teachers' Federation, Canadian Legion, School Board, Women's Institutes and other agencies concerned with educational problems, met with the directors for what turned out to be a very valuable discussion on general educational problems in the rural districts.

The problem of vocational guidance, including what should be done to assist and advise our young people what road to follow after completing Grade eight, the advantages of regional schools, the possibility of a night school program for the farm young people during the winter months, were the main points considered.

A committee was appointed to go into those matters further and present some definite recommendations to another session of this kind which will be called later in the summer. It was the general feeling that more get-togethers between such groups be held to exchange opinions and experiences regarding matters of education.

Other Business

After the general routine business of minutes, correspondence and financial report, which is presented at every regular meeting, several matters of current importance were discussed fully. A resolution supporting the Canadian

over the same period last year. The Domestic consumption of pork is up about 23 per cent over last year which indicates that an increased amount is being consumed at home. It is not expected that the British contract will be filled by July 1st as was expected. It does not seem possible that it will be filled before November, if then. The Federation has fairly reliable assurance that the present floor price on export bacon will remain in effect until the present British contract is filled.

Potato Resolution

At the recent directors meeting there seemed to be a feeling that there would be a surplus of potatoes left on the Island even in view of the large movement at the present time.

Action was taken to try and have provision made for some protection or help to offset any losses incurred by our smaller growers, if after the planting season they still have a surplus left which they were unable to market.

However, according to the trade today, there will be a demand for all our potatoes. Current prices however, are far below the cost of production.

Surpluses

At a meeting during the past week the question was raised as to "what could be done with food surpluses" anyway? It was suggested that farm prices and production must come down. It is difficult to answer this question in a few lines but, the shortest answer can be given in two words "distribute them".

Who should distribute them, is the big question among organized farmers in every agricultural country today. This will be the main issue at the International Federation meeting in Stockholm, Sweden which our Deputy Minister, Mr. Shaw left to attend this past week. We must remember that over three-fifths of the world's people are undernourished and hungry. The Federation proposes and has offered a detailed plan to set up an international marketing agency to do this world-wide job.

Actually there were always surpluses and probably always will be. It is not possible for instance for some 800,000 farmers in Canada to produce just exactly enough butter, cheese or any other commodity to meet the needs in any one season. There will always be either a small surplus or shortage. In most cases this small surplus upsells the price level for the whole crop. Our Dominion Government has made it clear that they are willing to help in future if the producers of those food commodities are willing to organize an orderly system of marketing and take the responsibilities of at least a detailed plan to set up themselves. The surplus might have to be distributed at lower prices to needy families either in Canada or in other countries but, we do not feel that farm people alone should have to sacrifice the returns of their complete crop in order to lower prices to a limited number of people with small incomes. This problem is the responsibility of all the taxpayers, not of any one group.

Farmers because they were never organized have had to accept this responsibility before. The main job the Farmers' Federation has set out to do and is doing, is to carefully study those problems and offer constructive suggestions and help toward solving them. At the same time protect the farmers interests and keep the returns to Agriculture in line with returns from other industries.

Poultry Plan

No definite action has been taken to date by the Poultry Committee toward setting up the Board as authorized in the recent published survey is being made of progress in the other provinces, and of the general outlook for the poultry industry.

A meeting will be called as soon as this information is obtained. Arrangements will be made to set up a poultry organization and be ready to put our marketing board plans into effect as soon as the other provinces are ready to do
