FULLER REVELATION IN GOD'S OWN TIME

Since by our very nature we desire to know, it is good news for us to learn through revelation that there is a possibility that one day we may see God face to face.

Here and now we can be certain by faith that all things are so; and yet, because we have reason, we cannot be content with the mere fact that something is so. We want to know how and why it is so.

However, we are confident in our ability to see the reasonableness of what we believe, so confident that some of us grow impatient, and instead of waiting for insight and wisdom to arrive in their own good time, they complain that their faith is weakened by difficulties and doubts.

Some go so far as to claim that rather than be always groping after a wisdom which we can never understand, it is better for us to give our attention to things which we can understand fully, even if they should happen to be not worth

understanding at all. In this class we can put the science of material things when it is considered not merely as a distinct and proper field of human knowledge, but in so far as it is set up as a knowledge which is opposed and hostile to that wisdom that flows from faith.

PRUDENT CHOICE
If we must separate this wisdom from science, and if we are forced to choose between them, a prudent man will bear in mind that whole peoples and many people within our own society have no appreciation of scientific knowledge and yet they are able to live happy lives by the light of a traditional wisdom.

The wisdom which science desires is one which can be attained
