## Abegweit-Crystal Rivalry

THE CHOICE of the name Crystals for the Summerside team brings back many memories to older hockey fans of great and bitter rivalry that flared between Charlottetown and Summerside in other years.

## 100 Telephone Calls

AT LEAST once the series was held up for committee disputes, "and at least 100 telephone calls", but finally a game in Summerside which produced fights on the ice and off, apparently, resulted in an order from Ott Schryer, president of the Maritime Amateur Hockey Association to play the final game in Moncton, when neither team would agree to go into the other's rink.

Can you imagine that? Two Island teams had to go off the island to settle their dispute in what is supposed to be sport. But that's what happened.

The Crystals won the game 5-3 and the Island championship. The Abbies had tied the Crystals 4-4 in the previous game at Summerside but the Patriot said Walter Lawlor had his jaw broken and that Ivan "Hickey" Nicholson was knocked unconscious and robbed in an alleyway after the game.

A Summerside paper said that Nicholson slipped and fell on the icy street while he was running to catch the train and was rendered unconscious. He was taken to hospital and returned home next day. The Summerside paper said that the Summerside Chief of Police was nearby and would have seen any attack had there been one.

W. G. (Bill) Gillespie was coaching the Abbies and Roy Prowse, a former Abegweit star, was coaching the Crystals. The benches were alongside each other, and at one stage Prowse observed, Bill recalled yesterday, "Anyone who ever has anything to do with sport after this affair tonight, should have his head examined."

I'm not writing this to put the blame on anyone, I wasn't there, and know nothing personally about it, I just want to tell you about some of the bitter rivalry that existed at the time.

Mr. Murley went to Moncton on the special train with 200 to 300 Charlottetown and Summerside fans, and recalls that "we even fought for broadcasting rights."

"BULLER", as Mr. Murley was known then, used to broadcast hockey games and he, and the technicians from Charlottetown, "rushed to the Moncton rink" as soon as they arrived, to get their equipment set up so they "would be sure of being on the air" when the game started.

Details are hazy after so many years, but "Buller" told me he finally agreed to split the broadcasting time with Summerside. "I took it upon myself to do it," he said.

The Crystals won the game decisively and despite the rabid rooting from the sidelines, it was clean as a whistle all the way through with not a sign of the rivalry and bad feeling that sent the game to Moncton in the first place.

There "was some brilliant hockey" . . . the two teams hit a terrific pace, and it "was a pointedly clean game" Buller said in the special story he wrote following the game.

Lineups carried in the paper here next day were Ray Stull in goal, Chick Williams, Pat Powers, Hal Spillout on defence; Johnny Squarebriggs, Hibbert Saunders, Ivan Nicholson, Austin MacDonald, a Montague boy, Frank "Duck" Acorn and Dee Gillis' forwards for the Abbies.

Ossie LeFurgey was the Crystal goal, Reg Saunders and Danny "Big" MacLeod were the Abbies' goalkeepers. Chick Gallant, Everett MacDonald, Ralph Silliphant, a Jamieson chap, whose name I think was Keith, and Jack Schurman were forwards.

# Angie Carroll Continues Hot Pace In Scoring Race

Angie Carroll continues to set a torrid pace in the ISHL scoring race. The shifty Parkdale puck-handler is tops in the scoring column, four points better than playing coach and teammate Buck Whitlock.

Carroll now has a total of 48 points on 25 goals and 23 assists, while Whitlock has scored 21 markers and assisted on 23 others. Five points back of Whitlock is another Royals' player, Alfie Flanagan with 16 goals and 23 assists.

Versatile Billy Mulligan of the Penguins follows, 10 points back of Flanagan on 14 goals and 15 assists and then three other Royal players take up the next three spots, Dick Carroll, Eustace Reeves and Jim MacLeod with 25, 23 and 21 points respectively.

Most penalized player in the league is defenceman Ralph Josey of the Royals with 68 points; Jack Kane, who hasn't been playing for some time has 62 in the sin bin and rearguard Eustace Reeves has spent a total of 1 hour in the penalty box.

**MOST PENALIZED**  
The Royals are also the most penalized team in the league with a total of 334 minutes followed by the Penguins at 298. Penguin netminders are still tops in the goals-against-average department. Butch Ward, Lyman MacInnis and Thane Doyle have compiled a 3.47 average with Royals' cagers in runner-up spot at 3.94.

The Whitlock coached Royals who are tops in the league standings, have clinched first place on 13 wins and 3 losses in 16 games for 26 points. Runner-up Old Spain Penguins have 20 points on 9 wins and two ties while Summerside Crystals are solidly lodged in third place with 17 points back of the Birds.

# Aussie Rod Laver Clinches Amateur Tennis Laurels

SYDNEY, Australia (AP) — Australia's Rod Laver clinched world amateur tennis laurels Monday by defeating countryman Roy Emerson in a four-set final of the Australian national championships.

The 23-year-old lefthander required 105 minutes in sweltering heat to subdue his close friend and fellow Queenslander, 33, 6-4, 6-4.

In dethroning the 23-year-old Emerson, Laver added the Australian crown to his Wimbledon title and spectacular successes against the Italians in the Davis Cup challenge round last month. Emerson still holds the U.S. championship, which he won at Forest Hills, N.Y., last September.

The poised, precision-hitting redhead now has beaten Emerson four straight times in major tournaments in Australia. Laver won the state titles in 1965, 1966 and 1967.

# NHL Uncooperative In Minor Hockey Week

CHARLOTTETOWN (CP) — Plus Callaghan, president of the Maritime Amateur Hockey Association, said Monday he agreed that National Hockey League teams were failing to co-operate with the Association in its minor hockey week.

Callaghan was commenting on a statement last Friday by MAHA vice-president Steve MacDonald of Sydney, who said he had written to the six NHL clubs asking them to send players or executives to the Maritimes to assist in Minor Hockey Week which begins Jan. 21.

MacDonald said he had not heard from New York Rangers or Boston Bruins but the other four NHL teams had turned down the request.

Callaghan said Montreal Canadiens were expected to send two players to the Maritimes during minor week last year but neither arrived.

MacDonald said he was prepared to place a motion before the next MAHA meeting calling on member clubs to refuse to transfer players to NHL teams unless the pros co-operate with Minor Hockey Week. Callaghan said this was MacDonald's personal view and did not represent the opinion of the MAHA which governs hockey in Nova Scotia, New Brunswick and Prince Edward Island.
