Re-opening Of Cape Traverse Church Of Scotland

Another chapter has been written in the history of the old historic Church of Scotland, Cape Traverse, P. E. I.

The first church was built during the ministry of the late Rev. Donald MacDonald in the year 1832.

In this, the 120th anniversary, under the ministerial care of the Rev. J. H. Bishop, the interior of the old church has been renewed.

All this, with a new coat of paint, new carpet, linoleum tramps, blinds, re-upholstering of minister's chair and new electrical fixtures, has added much to the beauty of the old church and shows that the example set by the founders and forebears of this congregation is being carried on faithfully and well by the present day members.

The fulfillment of the plans made at the annual meeting and a subsequent meeting of the congregation, were carried to completion by the building committee, composed of Elder Robert Carstairs, Harry MacFarlane, E. C. Bell, the whole thing being made possible by the splendid co-operation of members and friends in their generous response to the finance committee.

The re-opening services were held on the Sabbath, November 9th, when the pastor, the Rev. J. H. Bishop, was the speaker at morning and evening services.

This congregation has been truly blessed, in the line of settled ministers down through the years: the late Rev. Donald MacDonald, the late Rev. James MacColl, the late Rev. James MacDougal, the late Rev. Ewen MacDougal, and the present incumbent the Rev. J. H. Bishop, with intervening supply for short periods of time.

The present pastor is a graduate of Prince of Wales College, Dalhousie University, where he majored in English and history, taking distinction in English History and Philosophy, also the Free Church of Scotland University, Edinburgh, Scotland, where he came out second in his year.

Answers Tabled Re Charlottetown Airport Project

Official evidence that the item for extension of the Charlottetown airport facilities was still in the "being considered" stage at Ottawa on Dec. 10, is furnished by the House of Commons on that date by the Minister of Transport in reply to questions by Mr. McLure:

- Mr. McLure: 1. What is the length of the runways at Charlottetown Airport? 2. Has the Minister of Transport received any representations from (a) the City of Charlottetown; (b) the Government of Prince Edward Island, asking that these runways be extended to accommodate larger airplanes? 3. What action, if any, will be taken in reference to extending the accommodation at this airport?

Answer 1. East-West (09-27)—2093 feet long; southeast-northwest (14-32)—2496 feet long; north-south (18-36)—2705 feet long. 2. (a) Yes; (b) Yes. 3. The inclusion of an item for the first stage development of a new runway 7000 feet long is being considered for the Departmental 1953-54 Estimates.
