THE LURE OF A GRAND SLAM

Occasionally, a player's inability to resist temptation "pays off." That was the case in the following hand.

East dealer
 North-South vulnerable.

♠ 9 6 5
 ♥ Q 3
 ♦ J 7 2
 ♣ 10 6 5 4 2

♠ 3
 ♥ K J 10 8
 ♦ 4 2
 ♣ 8

♠ A K Q 10 7 4
 ♥ A 6
 ♦ A K Q 9 5

The bidding:
 East South West North
 1♥ 2♥ Pass 3♣
 2♥ 3♥ Pass 3NT
 3♥ 4♥ Pass 6♠
 7♣ (!) 7♣ Pass Pass

Even though it cost his side an extra 750 points, East could not be blamed for "pushing" South to the grand slam. Seven hearts (♠) which West undoubtedly would have gone if seven clubs had been doubled would have been a good sacrifice against the six-spade contract, and East had reason to hope that South had reached his limit at six spades. Actually, as South later admitted, he had known very well that he was gambling in going on to the grand slam, but the temptation had been too strong for him.

As it happened, the seven-spade contract was not too bad, considering that a 2-2 break of the missing spades, with no worse than a
