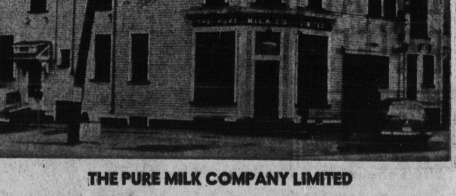
## Fortune UCW
