Lundy Island "Monarch" Buried

LUNDY ISLAND, England (Reuters)—The body of Martin Coles Harman, 69 London financier and "monarch" of tiny Lundy island in the Bristol channel, was ferried from the mainland to Lundy Wednesday and buried on the island he ruled like a feudal domain.

Harman bought Lundy for \$45,000 in 1925. He claimed that because it was outside the three-mile limit the island was a separate kingdom and not under the jurisdiction of the British crown.

Its dozen or so inhabitants enjoy a tax-free existence and freedom from Britain's strict drinking laws.

Once Harman even tried ninting his own coins until the British government stepped in and put a stop to it.

RAF INTERVENTION

CAIRO (AP)—An Egyptian government spokesman gave a blunt rebuff Wednesday to Arab countries intervening on behalf of Moslem Brotherhood leaders sentenced to death for plotting against Egypt's military regime. Egypt, he said, is prepared to send the whole brotherhood, its arms and leaders to the protesting countries.

Articulturists Discuss Artificial Insemination

Artificial insemination as it is carried on in the Province of New Brunswick was thoroughly discussed at an agricultural meeting held in Charlottetown yesterday. Dr. D. G. Moore, veterinarian, Central breeding unit, Fredericton, N. B.; Mr. J. C. Bennett, director of Livestock services in New Brunswick and H. K. MacCharles, Canada Department of Agriculture were present at the invitation of Hon. C. C. Baker, Minister of Agriculture, who outlined the plan and the regulations as they exist in the Province of New Brunswick.

The meeting was under the chairmanship of Dr. George Fisher who called upon Deputy Minister S. C. Wright to introduce the guests and give the background leading up to the meeting.

Dr. Moore said that artificial insemination has been carried on for a number of years and up to 1948 had disappointing results. With the building of a central unit at Fredericton for the collecting, handling and shipping of semen, it made satisfactory progress. To date 15 local units have been organized under the Co-Op act which hire a trained inseminator; decide on the charge and manage their own business.

It was pointed out that before a local unit is organized, it is desirable that 800 cattle are listed for using the semen with a potential of 2000. The cost to the members for the semen is very slight; the charge being the services and expenses of the inseminator. A considerable portion of the cost of the semen is absorbed by the New Brunswick Department of Agriculture.

The bull battery at Fredericton which is costly, is capable of servicing 50,000 cows. Last year only about 13,000 cows were bred artificially and because of this, the central breeding unit is prepared to supply semen to Prince Edward Island, if suitable arrangements can be made.

In the past year, frozen semen has been made available to the breeders and allows them the use of bulls for special breeding. This service, it was pointed out is available at an increased charge.

Members of both the provincial and federal departments of Agriculture were in attendance at the meeting. Mr. Lincoln Dewar represented the P. E. I. Federation of Agriculture.
