AT SAINT JOHN

At Saint John, N.B., last Saturday night, Jeanie Brewer 2.12 4-5, was the only double dash winner. She is owned by John Lawless of Saint John, and was driven by L. Lawless. The time was 2.12 4-5 and 2.18. Last year she performed over Ohio tracks where she took her record.

The second fastest mile on the program was stepped by Chesterway Thomas, owned by Wilson and Nicholson of Saint John and driven by E. Wilson. He won the fourth dash on the card in 2.16 4-5, and was second in the fifth dash to Little Bum Tide, driven by W. Carr. The time was 2.17 3-5. The fastest performance of the evening was turned in by Hickory Doc, driven by A. Davidson in the sixth race, time 2.14 3-5, which is the fastest mile stepped over the Saint John track this season.

Racing under the lights got underway at the Sports Center at Sydney, Cape Breton, last Friday night, and Aubrey Keiser, in his sports column, states that indications are that another fine season is shaping up. Naturally, when the weather gets warmer, the enthusiasm also will get warmer.

There are approximately 175 horses in Cape Breton now, and most of them will see action at the Center during the next few months. A nice start was that a newcomer, Joe Sutherland's Jackie Jackson, was a double winner in a new mark of 2.15. Also double winners were Long John, Lady Reamore and Acemore.

Aubrey also states that there is a lot of racing talk on the move, and one was the amalgamation of two prominent owners. R. J. Dick Logue and Duncan MacDonald, who have purchased Jackie Jackson from Joe Sutherland of Sydney. Duncan will handle the driving, but it's strictly a joint ownership with Mr. Logue.

There is also news that Joe MacDonald of Sydney Mines has returned for a week's vacation. He has been with the Sanders Russell stable at Yonkers Raceway, and when Mr. Russell was unable to drive Joe handled the horses and did an outstanding job.

The latest report we have from Yonkers Raceway is that on Thursday night, last week, the 25,000 Palisades Trot was won by Trader Horn (B. Haughton) 2, Steamin' Deamon (Phelan) 3, Lumber Boy (Lighthill) 3. Here is the time by quarters: 29 3-5, 1:00 2-5, 1:30 4-5, and the mile 2:01 2-5.

This sets up a new season's record trotting for a half-mile track, displacing the 2:02 mile by Mr. Saunders mentioned above in the opening paragraph. Mr. Saunders finished fifth in this race.

The pari-mutuel handle for the night was more than \$2 million, and the paid attendance was above 24,000.

Madame Leon Oly-Roederer's French trotting champion, Jamin, who will represent France in Roosevelt Raceway's \$50,000 International Trot on August 1st, is the "ranking hostess in Europe for champagne parties." Whenever Jamin wins a race, and he has won eight straight thus far in 1959 — his owner, Madame Oly-Roederer, of the world-famous champagne manufacturing family, sends a case of champagne to the press box, and another to the stable area, so newsmen and horsemen can join in celebration.

The champagne is always sent "compliments of Jamin."
