

Outfielder Dave Nicholson Helping Flying White Sox

NEW YORK (AP)—Baltimore Orioles gave up on Dave Nicholson, but the young outfielder is one of the major re-signings of the Chicago White Sox, flying high in the American League.

Nicholson, who received a bonus of almost \$100,000 to sign with Baltimore, is batting only .200 for the league-leading White Sox. However, he is tied for the top spot in home runs and runs batted in.

Nicholson drove in seven runs in last night's game against teammate Floyd Robinson for the capue here.

Nicholson's seven homers put him in a first place tie with Chuck Hinton of Washington and Tom Tresh of New York Yankees. The White Sox got Nicholson in a six-player trade last winter.

Wayne Causey of Kansas City continues to pace the American League in home runs, despite a 54-day drop to .352 in last week's action. The Kansas

Chicago's Robinson and New York's Clete Boyer are tied for second at .360. Robinson lost two points with eight hits in 24 times at bat while Boyer moved up 20 points with a 12-for-29 performance.

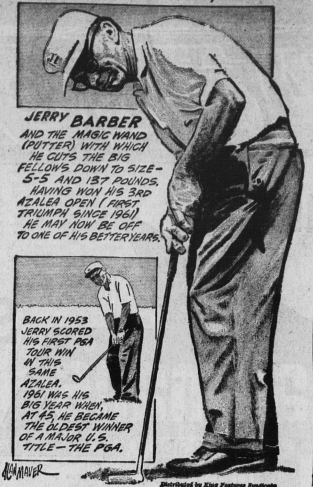

By DOMENICO GIORDANO ROME (AP) — With a stout heart and a shrewd mind, Jaroslav Drobný, 41, is still playing winning tennis.

He sees no reason why he shouldn't. After all, he says, the amateurs of his better days "were far better than the present ones."

What he gives to the present amateurs in age, he gets back in court cunning and uncanny accuracy.

But age has taken its toll. His strong legs, which once made him a great hockey player, cannot stand up to the pace.

The Czech-born star won three straight matches during the current Italian international tennis championships over ten players years his junior. Then he plays Sunday, that's all. Maybe after a while they'll be hitting when I'm not pitching so well and I'll win."
